The day passed very quickly what with following the routes and trying



HOW TO GET 59 MILES PER GALLON by Allen Rennie

While browsing thru some of our motor magazines I was amazed to find out that practically anyone can get uphaul in our engine and get 54.1% more to 59 miles per gallon simply by adding several items to his car.

We are getting 18 mpg at present, but by installing "Sparky-Matic" plugs we have now upped our mpg to 24! Quite a nice saving for \$9.95.

Now, lets turn a few more pages and see if we can't do a little better. Oh, yes. Here we are. For \$1.50 more we will add an "Aero-Flow" needle which users say adds up to 4. 5. or 6 extra miles. We'll be satisfied with just 4 extra mpg on this item because it only cost such a small amount. Now for \$11.45 we have our mpg up to 28.

A "Mileage Tend-To" can now be put on for \$6.95 and we'll jump up to 34 mpg. We have spent \$18.40 and are getting 16 more miles to the gallon than when we started. We are now sav-
