BATCHELLER'S CORNER by "Hap"

On the subject of wax jobs: the new one step waxes seem pretty good. I find Vista wax by Simonize to be the best from the standpoint of water spots especially

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on the aluminum panels. I notice at most concours d'elegance that the owners use Turtle wax because of its ease of use and its high luster but they state that it is short lived. If you prefer paste wax use two rags when rubbing off--use one (always the same one) to rub one layer off then the second to finish. Incidently, "waste" (at any large hardware) is even better than a rag.

Drive the ECONOMY CAR

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One of the hardest jobs after any doit-yourself project is cleaning up yourself. I recommend the hand cleaners "Go-Jo" or "D-L" (available at auto parts wholesalers such as Richmond Auto Parts or Condrey's.)
