

On the lower end of the pit area, the new Martini and Rossi vehicular bridge is going up, permitting easy automobile access.

Previously, cars had to cross the track in the early hours of race day, and they were frozen there until well after the 10 P.M. finish of the race.

The growing increase in attendance at Sebring (expected to top 40,000 this year) has made it necessary, primarily in the interest of safety, to limit the number of people permitted in the Taddock area.

The Paddock will feature a relaxation

area complete with hugh sun umbrellas and chairs. The Paddock is also being landscaped and planted with palm trees and gaily decorated for the festive day.

Paddock passes are available by advance reservation only at Race Headquarters in the Sebring Hotel. The \$10 fee includes auto parking on the infield.

New grandstands are being erected along the main straight and at several other

locations around the 5.2-mile winding paved course.

Activity starts Monday, March 17 and accelerates right up to the big day Saturday, March 22, when the world's outstanding sports cars and drivers compete for the Amoco trophy and \$13,000 in cash, plus the must sought world sports car championship points.
