



EDITORIAL

With the onset of another racing and rallye season, we are reminded of years past, when all too many "Hard Luck" trophies were awarded. Let us all keep our sense of values and relations as we drive home from the excitement of the track and when we are trying to make up that ten minutes on a rallye. It is at times such as these that we become all excited and the old foot goes down and the tach needle rises and without realizing it, we are driving about 100 feet behind the projected point of attention and this can result in undue hardship. Until now, we have been very fortunate on our rallies and no one has been hurt, however, we have bent some machines on fast rallies. Let this then be a warning to us and while either laying out or driving rallies, keep the speeds down.


We're looking forward to seeing each of you take an active part in this year's activities...activities which should fill your trophy shelves to capacity!




