Last minute arrival (like late!) and doubt about starting due to sloppy weather and a sick ignition --Surprised to even finish, and needless to say, tremendously excited on learning of a first place finish.

To explain our "superior" skill (!) and machinelike procedures for successful rallying to benefit those with less talent, we list the following helpful tips:

- Miss first turn, and in doing so, go 2.38 miles off course before odometer check. (This makes for more exacting odometer error computation.)
- Stop one and only stop watch on arrival at odometer check. (This gives driver lung exercise--navigator hides.)
- Always have female navigator as said navi-3. gator may have helpful equipment for reflection rally. (Other equipment also useful at times.)
- On counting, (silo bands, chimneys, trees, etc.) it is a valuable asset having one person who cannot count -- this leads to recounts which finally gets accuracy.
- 5. Ignore pre-rally instructions. alibis.)
- When lost, try not to realize it; if luck holds, you will end up back on course and never know the difference.
- For best results, acquire police escort for arrival at final check point.
