

presidency in '60.


However, the pattern was resumed the following year by President Charles and Pat Larus who became proud parents of a daughter.

But "Left at the stop," the instructions read!


Cecil and Edith were hardly speaking As they returned, their TR squeaking. But now it's all history; be of good cheer; Noel comes but once a year.
