



MAGAZINES FOR FREE

The February board meeting was held at Don Wiseman's. As I entered, I noticed on his coffee table three foot high stacks of magazines. Don told me to help myself as he was moving to Texas. Well, that was the wrong thing to tell me, just ask my wife. While the meeting was going on, I managed to quickly sift through about half of them. Shirley Patteson kept saying, "Wray, you will ruin your eyes", but I just couldn't stop. Right now I don't know which is in worse shape, my eyes or my bottom.

Bill Coney writing in Road and Track, has some very good advice. Read your owners manuel and do what it says. Burning of intake valves can be the result of using oils other than recommended by the Manufacturer. While the new detergent oils soak through gaskets and cost more, the manufacturer has a definite recommendation for each engine he makes. Excessive amounts of oil may be drawn down the valve stems by the intake vacumn which will carbonize on the under side of the valve head and eventually prevent the valve from seating . Hydralic valve lifters do all kinds of crazy things when incorrect oil is used. Their requirements are the determining factor in specifying an oil many times.

Have someone grease your car that knows it. The mixing of lubricants available today can cause deteriation of bothand in case of beoning grease, tone it to a thin oil. On some cars, fittings are not provided at points

such as your water pump that will be damaged by over greasing.

In the air cooled engines, use the proper gas and do not alter anything about the ignition system. If the initial advance setting of the distributor is increased, a marked increase in plug and head temperatures will occur. Value burning and broken rings can directly be traced to this case.

Cars equipped with paper air filters should be checked regularly. The fuel to air ratio changes with dirty filters and your car will run rich giving poor performance and high gas consumption. Some of the oil bath type air filters will act similarly.

Properly gapped plugs in the proper heat range will make starting easier and smoother operation at all loads and RPMs. I don't know of anything that restores the new feeling more than a change of plugs, ballancing the wheels and replacing weak or bad shock absorbers. TRY IT....
