



On Saturday, April 16, 1966, it was brought to the attention of the O.D.'s of the Azalea 8-Hour that car #34, an MG Midget entered by John and Nona Chehaske, had been scored as never having passed through checkpoint #5. Upon checking the log from this checkpoint, it was found that the car had not, indeed, been timed in. John and Nona, however, stated that they had passed through this control, and this fact was verified by several other contestants. In addition, it was found that one of the photographs taken by the checkpoint head during the course of the rally clearly shows car #34 passing the pylon. This picture appears elsewhere in this issue of "Checkpoints". Correction of this error gives the Chehaske's 300 points on this checkpoint rather than 600 as originally scored, dropping their total score from 1150 to 850, and raising them from 9th to 3rd place. The O.D.'s have, therefore, elected to give duplicate 3rd place trophies to the Chehaske's, and to revise the standing of all contestants who originally finished between 3rd and 9th. The new standing is as follows:

5 - C. E. and Tom Gullette, # 30

6 - Jerry and Brent Cavedo, # 31 7 - Virginia and Ed Lorenzen, # 26

9 - Bob Kennedy and G. Howe, # 40




