#### RALLY ROULETTE

Upon arriving at the starting point, we parked on the side of the Village Ssso away from the other rally contestants. We had no secrets to hide nor did we do this, as suggested by some, to keep from shaming those with beautifully prepared and cleaned cars ready for the concourse by showing them up with our immaculate Volvo; but only to get the beast started on the down slope since the battery was dead. 
