

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

The Board of Directors of Virginia Motor Sport Club proposes the following amendments to the VMSC Bylaws:

- Annual dues shall be \$8.00 for an individual membership and \$10.00 for a family membership and shall be payable on or before January 1.
- Initiation fee of \$10.00 will be charged for all new members and any members 30 days in arrears.
- Presently, dues are \$5.00 and \$8.00 for individual and family memberships respectively, and the initiation fee is \$5.00.

These amendments will be presented for adoption at the regular monthly meeting in December. An affirmative vote of a majority of members present is necessary for adoption.


