On Sunday, August 11, 1968
Cecil Wright will officiate at a concours d'elegance while Billy Dixon O.D.'s a fun rally. The rally is set to start from Bryan Park Shelter number two at 10:30 in the morning. After a leisurely drive through the countryside for approximately an hour and a half contestants will return to shelter number 2 for a picnic lunch. Beer and soft drinks will be available, sales of which help to award better trophies.

After the picnic lunch judging for the concours will begin around 2:00 with judges John Kessler, Allen Fine, and Cecil Wright doing the honors. On page 4 of this newspaper is an entry blank for the concours showing what areas will be judged and the respective weight given to each. You may bring the entry blank with you or pick one up when you enter. Trophies will be awarded for the first six cars. Price is set at \$3.00 for each event separately, or \$5.00 for the two combined. Additional cars may be entered in the concours for \$2.00 each.



Have you ever worked an open checkpoint? If so, does the above sound familiar? It should, because I think jam-ups occur on almost every checkpoint throughout a long and/or tough rally. Why then, are we loathe to go to open controls? Open controls can and almost always do require more people to work them but the chance of an error is greatly reduced by the fact that the contestant (if they are good rallyists - if they're not it almost doesn't matter) is checking on your recorded time. Too often is the case that a car is not timed, is timed wrong, or later protests an alleged timing error. Open controls can eliminate MOST, if not ALL, of such errors.

Every O.D. likes to have some new twist for checkpoint location and one can only have praise that such fertility abounds within our ranks. However, if a novel approach or location results in some rank errors what is the effect? Frustration, dissention, that's what. Sure, rallies may be longer time-wise due to open controls and they may require more diligent planning. But it seems folly to run a rally any other way. Don't you agree?

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
