EDITORIALLY SPEAKING

How gratifying it is to make a suggestion and have it listened to and acted upon. You may recall that last month your editor threw out a little barb about our failure to take that last step--toward better events. As examples we mentioned publicity and pre-arranging of helpers.

Well members, you have seen the reaction. John Chehaske and Wilto Greenwood put together a fine autocross with plenty of publicity and I might add that helpers were lined up well in advance and were aware of the job they were to do. And each type of job had a man in charge to see that all went well. And well it did go as publicity produced 52 fire breathers for the Fall Autocross and the whole affair came off smoothly except for yours truly who apparently got his driving license at PEP BOYS. An advance pat on the back is also due George and Nancy Winfree who have gotten out a flyer to bring in the entries to their A.U.T.U.M.N. RALLYE which I've heard is to be a very fine event.

This is what I call progress and you may be interested to know that some real progress was made at this month's board meeting. For one thing we aired at length the problem of trophies. You see we felt that no one area has caused as much griping in the past few years as trophies. What kind of trophy, how many trophies, what classes get trophies, fairness of trophies for different places ??? I could go on and on. Well we took the Bull By The Horns and came up with what we all felt was a workable solution.

Number of trophies for autocrosses remains as stipulated in the autocross rules since this solution has proven that it works satisfactorily. In rallies trophies will be given for first, second, and third Overall and first, second, and third Unequipped if such class exists. In all events the second place trophy will be approximately 80% of the value of the first; and the third place trophy will be approximately 80% of the value of the second; and so on down the line. Type of trophies and total amount of money to be spent are to be decided by the O.D. and the trophy chairman. Equal positions in each class will be awarded approximately equal trophies.

Further progress was made at the meeting as the chairmen of the Rally Committee and the Autocross Committee indicated that they were developing a checklist for all events so that O.D.'s would be sure not to overlook any details and new O.D.'s would have some guidelines as to how to set up an event.

Who could help but say that we're "ON THE ROAD TOWARD BETTER EVENTS".

VMSC MASSACRE

"Gimmic rallies are a farce." "A rally cannot be both easy and enjoyable." "The trouble with gimmic rallies is the winner is determined by chance." The above quotes are often heard amid much bitching and cursing from many experienced ralliests when the summer rally season rolls around. Unfortunately they are usually correct. However, the 1969 Picnic Rally was a shining example that this is not necessarily true.

This was accomplished by giving each car a county map and a set of instructions. The idea was to traverse the least distance (on the map) between each instruction. This almost completely eliminates the difficulties normally encountered in course following. Although, to make things more interesting, two instructions were lettered rather than numbered. The lettered instructions were floaters, which were to be executed at the first opportunity. By using unmanned controls it was not necessary to calculate during the rally. This allowed the navigator to help the driver look for answers to questions which were included as part of the rally. Answering the questions proved to be more difficult than staying on course.

The Dixons and Hatches deserve congratulations for finding a way to make a rally easy and still retain the exactness and competitive nature that makes rallying so enjoyable.




