
EVENTS GALENDAR

EDITORIALLY SPEAKING

Where do you turn for an editorial when you can't think of anything philosophical to say? I guess you just turn to specifics. I do have a few thoughts I'd like to impart in the hopes they may have some influence on future O.D.'s. They all come under the general heading of "thinking ahead". By that I mean the considering of all possible contingencies in order to be prepared to make events as fair as possible. I should at this point clarify the fact that I don't wish to be critical of any event. My intention is to refer to some specifics from past events and with constructive criticism, make some valid suggestions for future events.

You have no doubt heard me mention the fact that especially in a gymkhana there is real need to think ahead so nothing unintentional will occur which will give an unfair advantage. Several of us today had the pleasure of participating in a PCA combination FN-khana and Gymkhana. There was a gimmic in the Fun-khana in which your navigator hopped out of the car and put on a heavy parka, zipped it up, un-zipped it, and took it off again. Two things knocked yours truly completely out of the contention. 1) My navigator was too large for the parka and 2) The last entrant

left the parka with sleeves turned inside out. THINK AHEAD.

We surely enjoyed Neale and Judy Dickinson's Halloween Rally this year, but it had one little defect. Although it was a gimmic rally, it was technically sound and gave just enough challenge to be really fun. In my opinion it was an unfortunate decision to have it finish with a list of objects which each gave points if you had them in your car. You see this is taking an otherwise fair and sound rally and giving bonus points for pure luck. Also one scheming crew (after all, all is fair in love, war, and rallying) asked if they had to stay around and when the O.D. said nay, they headed for a nearby home where they got such unlikely things as a footstool and all for bonus points. A third and final point I'd like to make concerns the Unequipped class in rallying. I personally have found much satisfaction in our decision to create a separate class for Unequipped ralliests. The only problem is that we leave it entirely up to the O.D. as to whether or not to have such a class. O.D.'s seem to base their decision on how much calculation there is on the rally. My point here is that this year has seen a lot of rallies which did not have too much calculation, but in which mileage did matter. And it is a decided advantage to have correct mileage in hundreds as compared to questionable mileage in tenths (Or perhaps even miles in a VW.) In fact I even remember a hare and hound type rally last year in which we were often behind an equipped car. At each corner we had to get out and run up the possible turns to find a mark. The equipped car drove up each turn with his halda cut off and when he found the right one, came back and cut it on. Needless to say, a decided advantage over the unequipped ralliest, although there was no such class. I personally wish O.D.'s would THINK AHEAD in the creating of classes. If mileage is a factor at all then in my opinion, there should be an unequipped class.
