





Denouement Rally

The December rally, as indicated by the scores, was that type of event which required both driver and navigator to concentrate on course following for the duration of the event. Thus, those cars which were running "seat of pants" seemed to have an advantage over the equipped rallyists who spent much time with the navigators' head buried in calculations.

Mike Castleberry and Beth Beverage set out to put on a difficult priority rally as the final event of the year and they did so very well. They used lettered instructions (which overlapped subsequent instructions), numbered instructions (which must be executed chronologically), and several types of automatic route changes in putting together an excellent rally.

One of the more interesting lettered instructions caused several contestants to miss the third checkpoint without realizing they had done so unless someone spoke up subsequently at a transit zone. Another trap was a left at a "STOP" sign which did not apply to your route but was quite obvious at the intersection where you were to turn - quite a few experienced teams were caught on this one. Naturally a checkpoint was only one or two tenths of a mile away!

Fortunately for us, the rally ended early due to darkness (we were all an hour late getting started) and no one will ever know whether or not we could have done as well on the leg that was thrown out as we did on the others!

To the OD's and their helpers, we say congratulations on a job well done. It was an excellent rally in all aspects.

Message from the President

VMSC is an activity club, and it is the hope of the club officers that 1971 will be a year of increased participation by the membership. We hope to gain this increase by having good competitive events, and interesting and informative meetings. Always remember that VMSC is your club, and only through your participation can it be sustained.

We have a total membership of some 165, and in 1970 102 different members participated to some degree, if only to attend one meeting. Our problem arises, however, when we examine our events separately. During 1970 the average attendance at meetings was 40, the average participation at rallys was 39 (this includes contestants and helpers), and the average participation at speed events was 22 (this includes contestants and helpers).

In an effort to get greater meeting attendance we plan to have at the meetings general discussions of club affairs, and the President will report to the membership on the proceedings of the board meetings which are held on the Thursday before the club meeting. We are doing this to keep the membership informed, as we believe that an informed membership is an interested and active membership.

Every effort will be made to have our cutdoor activities (mainly rallys and autocrosses) of the highest calibre, and we encourage and invite your participation as both contestant and helper. Although the number of contestants was low for our 1970 rallys, the lack of helpers presented an even greater problem. It was especially bad in November and December, and to keep competition at a maximum the OD's had to just skim by with a minimum number of helpers. We have gone to open checkpoints pretty generally, and a rally with 5 checkpoints needs 20 helpers as a minimum or 4 per control, and we have been getting by with 2 or 3 per control. In view of this, please consider helping even if you are not interested in running. Volunteers are always welcome.

One last thing - If, during the year, you have a problem, question, or suggestion concerning your club, please feel free to contact any of the officers on it.


