


#### MUTTERINGS








The "Snow Plow," Fred and Marian DeBardeleben's January rally, was expected to be an unusual event long before it was due to be run. This was mainly because Fred and Marian don't exactly qualify as your run-of-the-mill novice O.D.'s, having taken to the sport with an enthusiasm which more normal couples reserve for extramarital inter-digitation. They've run more rallies in and out of Richmond in the last year or so than most of us have since we started. Nevertheless, this was to be their first try at putting on an event, and there was a certain amount of apprehension in the ranks. We bit hard on a generals trap which stated that a certain course-following priority could not be executed in a free zone (we had been warned about it earlier, too) and drove 20 miles on some beautiful roads that I'll wager the O.D.'s would have loved to use, if only they'd known they existed.

All in all, our only complaint about the entire rally was that we felt more callback mileages should have been present. Five miles off-course for the error we made would have been a generous plenty. This ofission was minor, though, compared with the total excellence of the event, which we felt to be one of the most interesting we've run anywhere. If Fred and Marian continue to improve the quality of local rallying as they did with this event, maybe we can sell next year's "Snow Plow" to SCCA for a Divisional.




