



When I said I would write about the changes in the Club this year, I had no idea that it would become a full time job. It has!


I hope you noticed the change in meeting place. This will be a one-shot deal until the Indoor Activities Committee can find a better location (cheaper or more central). Beer and soda will be available at the usual prices. However, we will now make the profit instead of the Hickory Hearth.

Speaking of the Hickory Hearth, the reason we no longer meet there is that they have once again changed managers (they change managers more often than Greenwood changes his socks), and the new manager knew essentially nothing of our arrangements, so he rented the room to another group every third Thursday. The Indoor Activities Committee is currently looking for a permanent meeting place.

Autocross classes have also changed this year. As you can see listed in this issue, there are three divisions: Stock, Prepared and Modified.

To run in the Stock class, you must have a 1968 or newer foreign car or any year American car that is showroom stock, with the following exceptions: You may perform normal tune-up functions (points, plugs, condenser, etc.) on your car. Any shocks are legal provided they mount on the stock mounting points. You may change to radial-ply tires comparable to stock size. No recaps are allowed and the tires must have at least 1/16" of tread.

The Prepared class offers a little more leeway. The only changes allowed to the engine are carburetor jets, distributor timing and the removal of the air cleaner(s). The suspension, however, is virtually unlimited as long as you retain stock mounting points. You may have noticed that the changes I've mentioned seem like last year's stock class. It is. There is, however, one big change. Wheels may be $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wider in most classes. Solid axle Vettes and V-8 pony cars are allowed 7" maximum width wheels while other Vettes are allowed up to 8" wheels. You may not do any body modification to allow for the wider wheels and tires. Recaps may be used and there is no tread requirement as long as there is no cord showing.

Racing tires are not allowed. You may update and backdate your car as long as both are in the same class and are essentially the same. No 1275 Bugeyes or 510's with 610 engines.

You got a race car? No? Then why run in a race car class? Modified is essentially an SCCA Production class set—up. If it's legal for production racing, it's legal for Modified. If it ain't, it ain't. These are the only classes where racing tires are legal. All cars with Webers, etc., engine swaps, wheels too wide, or any other major changes, must run in A/Mod.

Well, that in my usual long-handed verbiage is the autocross set-up for the coming year. Technically written classing structures, class breakdowns, and the move-up schedule (used for Club points allocation) will be available at the first autocross.



NOTES FROM THE BOARD MEETING - - -

Indoor Activities Committee authorized to buy beer and soda for resale at Club functions.

Competition Committee report: Protest on CP#2 was upheld and score adjusted (overlap). CP#3 was protested for backward facing sign. Upheld CP#8 discarded because it closed too early. CP's 9, 10 and unmanned were dropped by OD's.

Comp. Comm. also proposed some changes to the By Laws which will be published elsewhere in this issue. To be acted upon by the general membership. November last, the team of East & East went gaily off for its first rally. Upon entering the parking lot for registration, the team's superbly unequipped rally car dropped its transmission. The rally was run in a 1961 Corvair van with three cylinders (the thing originally had six, but that's another story). The Board proposes the following changes in the By Laws of the Virginia Motor Sport Club, Inc.:

Article V, Paragraph I. Change to read as follows:

Initiation fee of \$10.00 will be charged to all new members, and for members in arrears past February 1st or 30 days after billing date, whichever is later.

Article VIII, Paragraph II. Change "He" to "The Executive Vice President"

Paragraph III. Change "He" to "The 2nd Vice President"

Paragraph VI. Change to read as follows:

The Treasurer shall collect all dues and fees, maintain a complete and accurate voucher register, be responsible for all receipts and disbursements, present a monthly financial statement to the President and present his records for annual audit by three (3) Board members or by a Certified Public Accountant.

Article X. Change to read as follows:

Any amendment to these By Laws must be submitted to the Board of Directors of The Club for its approval. If such amendment is approved by the Board, the amendment shall be presented to The Club for its approval, and it shall be presented at any specified meeting not sooner then ten (10) days after a copy of the proposed amendment has been mailed to all members. A majority of the members in good standing present shall be necessary to adopt any amendment.

Article XI. Add the complete Article, as follows:

Meetings of The Club shall be governed by the rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order in all cases in which they are not inconsistent with these By Laws. The President shall appoint an ad hoc Parliamentarian.
