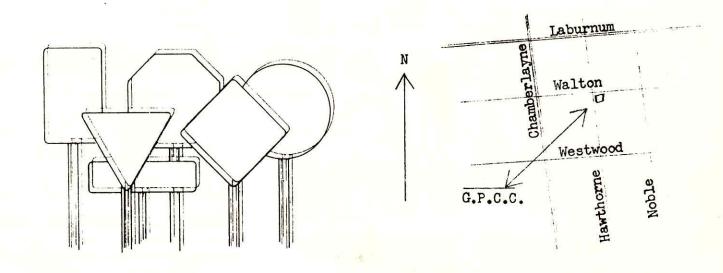

EDITORIAL

Not long ago, four of us were putting an issue of Checkpoints together. This was a first, in that this year, dues cards were being imprinted and mailed with the newsletter. All was going well until we fot to a member who had penned in a third name on his dues notice. Unheard of! Unparalleled! Immediate questions arose: Do we send three cards? If not, which two do get cards? Consultation of the By-Laws and pertinent Competition Regulations gave no unequivocal answers. We finally agreed that, since it was a family membership, all three would get membership cards. Out of such simple acts, thorny issues grow.

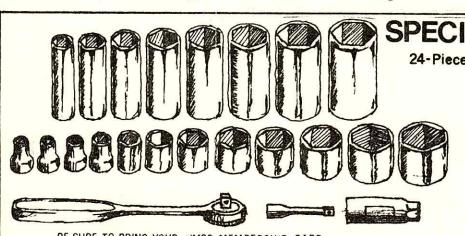
We realized that this set a precedent, so we decided to inform the Board and seek to have clarified the matter of family membership.

Somewhere along the line, the issue broadened to include a general discussion of membership: Life and Single as well as Family. Thus, a series of questions gradually were formulated.

- 1. What is a Family Membership?
- 2. Who is included in a Family Membership?
- 3. Are children (of family members) also members?
- 4. If children are members, can they accrue Club points?
- 5. If children are members, can they become Life members?
- 6. If children are not members, are they guests when competing in Club events?
- 7. If children are not members, are they subject to the "guests may compete in two events" rule?

Until now, it has been custom (as opposed to rule) for a family membership to consist of two people, usually husband and wife, with occasional exception to include father and son. However, since we have no written definition of "family membership", we are obliged in case of question to assume the general dictionary definitions for these terms. Thus, if I seek a family membership, it will include my wife and my children no matter where they may live. The answers to questions three through five above, then become yes, yes and yes, with questions six and seven being irrelevant. This leads to some mighty interesting absurdities, as for instance, a child becoming a life member before he (or she) is old enough to drive.

On the other hand, if question three is to be answered "no", we face some equally absurd problems. In the first place, VMSC's "family" will differ, without explanation, from that in usual practice. Furthermore, they (and the wife in a father-son family membership) must be considered as guests and the answers to questions six and



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seven are yes and yes.

And finally, question five can also be discussed in terms of "Can we continue or should we stop granting Life Memberships?" I will not comment on this, except to point out that one-third of our membership now hold life memberships.

Your Board of Directors has spent an inordinate amount of time wrestling with the problems outlined here. They have offered some solutions. One such, eliminating the "two events" rule, was approved by the Club. Another, that of carefully defining what and who constituted "family members" was intended to eliminate the absurdities inherent in the possibility of young children becoming life members, dominating Club points standings because of a strong parent, voting and holding office, etc. The Club members would have none of this solution and this kettle of worms is beginning to stink. The careful reader will note that this month's point standings include several members' children. This situation will and must remain until some semblance of rationality is attained by both Board and Club. Start now, before we are forced to acknowledge that children are and have a right to be Life Members!
