#### LESSONS IN STICK-TO-IT-IVENESS

(or

How to run a January rally)

Perseverance sometimes really does pay off. In the face of high gas prices, unpredictable weather, and a complete lack of compression in the Vega's third cylinder, we showed up at the Short Pump School, confident of overcoming all the obstacles and having a good run. We had saved enough for gas, the weather turned good, and the three-cylinder Chevrolet was going as well as could be expected. Then, as we received the instructions at the start line, the car stalled. After about ten minutes of playing with the distributor which had decided to be troublesome, we had given up and were going home. When the car finally started, though, we gave it a last effort and set off for the odo check.

Once into the rally, our Vega figured that we meant business and started to perform very well, thereby allowing us to concentrate on an enjoyable rally we would have hated to have missed. The weather, the scenery, and the roads were fantastic. Variety was lacking in the average speeds, but one doesn't really need to change speeds every ten feet. What traps were used were varied and clever, other than the interchanged instruction numbers, and had controls located so as not to send rallyists off into the boondocks. We particularly hate to have to drive twenty miles at 90MPH to find a control after a simple error. Bookie's rally was error-free, interesting, and above all FUN, an attribute missing from so many recent rallies: we can only hope there will be many more like it.

#### QUASTIONNAIRE RESULTS

Early in January we sent out a questionnaire looking for opinions on the energy crisis and our 1974 events. Approximately a 20% return showed that our members would support a reduction in events if absolutely necessary. The preferred number of rallies ranges from 10 to 12, with support of Saturday rallies, but only as a second choice to Sunday. For autocrosses, the opinion is to have 5-6 events, and preferably more if possible. Many respondents attached suggestions to their questionnaires. A few of the ideas received are: running at Green's Raceway because of its privacy, an economy run open to the public, gymkhanas, and more social events. All of the ideas are appreciated and will be considered seriously. For now, our rallies will remain 75-80 miles long. We have an autocross coming up soon and a field trial planned for April. And the Outdoor Activities Chairman is looking for a hill for everyone to climb!

#### The New Competition Committee

The competition committee, consisting of Mike Castleberry, Marian DeBardeleben, Bill Britton, Ed Duck, George Winfree, and alternate Bob Hollinger established the following rule for its actions this year. If any member of the protest board is involved in a protested event, whether as O.D., official precheck, or protestor, of a given event, he will not be allowed to sit on the contest board for that meeting, but will be replaced by the alternate or if necessary, a person chosen that day.

The Competition committee passed these changes to the competition regulations on to the board for their consideration. They were a proved by the board, and are effective immediately.

THE 4 FOLLOWING PAGES (DOUBLE-SIDED) SHOULD BE INSERTED IN YOUR SPEED REGS IN PLACE OF THE IDENTICALLY NUMBERED PAGES NOW INCLUDED. ALL OF THESE CHANGES ARE EFFECTIVE AS OF FEBRUARY 7, 1974.

Change to the Comp Regs, Section 1, Paragraph i, p.2:

ready approximately three weeks prior to the date of the event. Sanction may be withdrawn by the 2nd Vice-President or, in his absence, by the President, if he deems that the rally has not been adequately prechecked.

Change to the Comp Regs, Section 2, Paragraph c, p.2:

c. Deleted as of February 7, 1974.

Change to the Comp Regs, Section 12, Paragraph a, p.7:

#### 12. Definitions

- a. EQUIPPED RALLYIST Any car in which there is mounted or available ANY of the following:
  - 1) Rally computer (e.g., Tommy Box, ROBO, Zeron, Speed Pilot, etc.)
  - Cumulative calculating device (e.g., a Curta, electrical or digital mechanical calculators, adding machine, or similar devices)
  - 3) An operative odometer having a 1/100th mile digit and/or a reversible feature. Tape over the readout does NOT render an odometer inoperative.

Change to the Speed Regs, Section 6, Paragraph L, p.5:

- 1. Cars with swing-axle drive wheels having neither camber compensator nor negative camber may be allowed at the discretion of the OD but are not recommended.
- m. If exhaust suppression is required, each entrant must provide a quiet exhaust system. The criterion is not what the system consists of but rather the sound level. Any car deemed by the OD to be excessively loud shall not compete, regardless of the type of exhaust system installed.

Change to the Speed Regs, Section 6, Paragraph M., p.6:

Cross out "system installed" now included on p.5.

Change to the Speed Regs, Section 7, Paragraph 7.3, p.6:

7.3 STOCK CLASSES: For the VMSC class system the term "stock" means the original standard equipment item or specification for the listed year/model of the car as available in the U.S. It does not mean any factory optional equipment, unless specifically permitted by these rules. If your dealer included wider wheels that normally cost extra, at no charge to you, they are still not "stock." If specific models are not listed, then all models normally available in the U.S. are meant to be included. With the exception of tire profile, absolutely no up-dating or back-dating is allowed.

Change to the Speed Regs, Section 7, Paragraph 7.3.2, p.8:

- k. Add a fire extinguisher, scattersheild for clutch and oil catch tank
- 1. Add a rollbar and if necessary modify or replace the seats to facilitate the rollbar installation, as long as the total weight of the car is not reduced (including removal of rear seats in sedans). Seats must be fully padded and upholstered.
- m. Change steering wheel as long as the outside diameter remains the same as stock

Change to the Speed Regs, Section 7, Paragraph 7.3.2.F, p.7:

f. Factory (or otherwise) appearance options, such as chrome trim, vinyl roofs, deluxe interior, spoilers, instruments and gauges, radios and air conditioners are permitted, so long as they have no significant effect on the performance of the car.

7.7 Regular production cars not included in the class schedule will be classed by the OD and technical inspector as they appear. Either the owner of the car so classified or anyone in that class may ask for a review of placement by the VMSC Competition Committee. No fee need accompany the request. The VMSC Competition Committee will study the car's competitive position and arrive at a final determination.

### 8.0 LADIES CLASSES

There will be one (1) ladies class for the award of event trophies, which will be awarded as specified in 9.0 below. This will be done with finishing positions determined by use of the following index:

Points will be awarded to the ladies in accordance with their position in class using the following index:

If it becomes necessary to homologate the ladies classes with the men's classes for the purpose of points, then points will be awarded on the basis of raw time. Ladies may elect to compete in the men's classes. If so, their points will be awarded on the basis of raw time.

# 9.0 TROPHIES

There will be no homologation of classes for trophy purposes. Trophies will be awarded on the basis of one (1) trophy per every four (4) cars or any fraction thereof in each class. For example:

A maximum of 5 trophies may be awarded to any one class.

## 10.0 VMSC COMPETITION POINTS

If a class has fewer than 5 entries, it shall be combined with another class for VMSC points purposes only as follows:

Ladies into men's classes on raw time.

## 11.0 CHANGES

Changes to these regulations must be approved by the Board of Directors. Any emergency classification decisions necessary at an event shall be reviewed by the VMSC Competition Committee and a report filed at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Directors, at which time a permanent decision for future events will be made.
