



### Further Mucking

Went to see about Weekend With VMSC. Billed as weekend of fun and frolic, beginning with beer guzzlin' and carousin' on Satu day night followed by field trials on Sunday. Latter event entitled Further Muck. Made note to inquire about meaning of that.

And so first to beer drinkin' evening. Held in cozy party room at Cabin Creek Apartments. Arrived late, found party well advanced. Apparently good amount of beer already guzzled but carousin' minimal. Row of ladies on sofa, folks clustered around keg. The usual. Best Single Performance Award to L. Wilson for winning Battle of Kazoo and Guitar. whoda thought of dueling kazoos? Fact is, whoda thought of kazoos? Many trips to keg, seemed holding up well. Noticed coterie of male attendees staying at keg, decided social equivalent of ladies arrayed on sofa. Only difference, ladies, once in position, are stuck for evening. Interesting sociological point; must pursue. Beer finally out, guitarists numb, throats scratchy and so happily home and to bed.

And the next morning, up and hie me to Ellerson for Further Muck - field trials a la Greenwood and Castleberry. Found ODs had discovered ideal spot for further mucking: long-sought headwaters of the Chickahominy. Course nicely laid out with brave orange pylons in intricate oval. DeBardeleben backs into mud; Greenwood and Castleberry thinking their bike is light enough to float; Clark plowing into swamp at 30, fish-tailing to complete stop gunwale deep. rolling down window and screaming, "This is the dumbest ...ing\*\* thing I ever did!"

Enough. Results elsewhere in this issue. Both events superb, well-planned, enormous fun. Hope Indoor and Outdoor Activities chairmen mash plans often; idea of combined event good and great enjoyment.



### HIGHLIGHTS OF THE GENERAL CLUB MEETING

March 21, 1974

The Chairman of the Competition Committee presented to The Club proposed changes to the By Laws. They were passed unanimously, and you will find them elsewhere in this issue. The special committee, chaired by Wilt Greenwood, which came up with the amendments was congratulated.

The following "Statement of Policy for Energy Conservation" was read by the Chairman of Public Relations & Education:

"The Virginia Motor Sport Club, in response to the obvious need for fuel conservation, intends to do its part by taking the following actions:

- 1) The number of competitive events during 1974 will be reduced by 16%.
- 2) The length of rallies will be reduced from the usual 125 miles to 75-80 miles, a reduction of 35 to 40%.

These two actions will result in an overall reduction in fuel consumption of 45-50%. It should be noted that this is a significantly greater reduction than is recommended by the Federal Energy Office with regard to leisure activities."

It was suggested that all members adopt the above as a uniform reply to questions about VMSC activities.

There were 8 guests present at the meeting (Berle & Lou Wilson, Paul Schmidt, H. McDowell, Ralph Vawter, Ellen Hamilton, Steve Garrigives, and Brian Ely) and 4 new memberships (Art & Diane Wingo, Jeffery Bromm, Tom Gray, and John & Suzanne James).

NEW BUSINESS. Two students from Junior Achievement at Douglas Freeman High School were present to sell trouble lights to the members.

Dave Preston reported that the Chesterfield Highway Department would be much happier if OD's removed after a rally signs that they had added to the environment. Fred DeBardeleben said that it should be unnecessary for any OD to change signs on a rally course. Chuck Hoelzel added that street signs cost \$10.00 apiece.

Tom Blot, the trophy chairman, requested that OD's shorten the names of their rallies to decrease the cost of engraving. He asked if the membership would be willing to accept trophies that were neither pewter nor silver, e.g., ceramic. The break-even point for standard trophies on a rally is 23 1/2 cars at \$4.00/car. Many suggestions were made (raising rally prices to \$4/5.00, having the trophy chairman deal directly with the OD's, giving metal trophies for 1st place and dash plaques for other winners), and the majority of those present showed willingness to deviate from standard metal trophies.

There was a new trophy prepared for the DAM Award - an ungodly monster to be presented to the most deserving Dumb Ass of the Month.

"The Wild & Wonderful World of Auto Racing" was shown after the meeting.







# ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation, hereinafter sometimes called "The Club," shall be

"VIRGINIA MOTOR SPORT CLUB, INC."

# ARTICLE II Object

To stimulate and promote interest in the sport of motoring.

# ARTICLE III Membership

### I. Regular Members

Membership in The Club shall be restricted to persons who are interested in The Club and its objectives. Applications for membership, accompanied by payment of the initiation fee and annual dues, must be signed by two members in good standing and approved by the Board of Directors.

### II. Honorary Members

Honorary membership may be conferred on any nominee by a majority vote of the membership.

### III. <u>Guest</u>

Members may bring guests to all functions except those designated as closed events.

### IV. Life Members

Members who have maintained Regular Membership in The Club for eight years shall receive Life Member status. Life Members shall not be required to pay annual dues and shall receive all privileges of Regular Membership (November 1964), except that they shall not be entitled to free receipt of Club publications. Life members shall not be considered "active members" for purposes of determining the size of the Club's membership roster.

### ARTICLE IV

- I. Annual Dues shall be \$8.00 for a single membership, \$10.00 for a family membership (\$5.00 per individual member), and shall be payable on or before January 1.
- II. Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues.
- III. Applications received from new applicants after June 30 will be charged one-half (1/2) of annual dues.
- IV. The basic family membership shall consist of one adult individual and either his spouse or minor child. Their minor children not included in the basic membership may be included as members of The Club for an annual dues payment of \$5.00 each. After a child attains his majority of 18 years, he must maintain his own individual or family membership if he desires to remain a member. Member minor children shall be granted all privileges of membership. Any family member who attains life membership status shall become exempt from annual dues, without in any way affecting the dues-paying status of other members of his family. Example: A family membership which consisted of two members would pay \$5.00 annual dues if one member became eligible for life membership.

# ARTICLE V

#### Initiation Fee

Initiation Fee of \$10.00 will be charged to all new members and for members in arrears past February 1st or 30 days after billing date, whichever is later.

# ARTICLE VI

### I. Annual Meeting

The annual meeting shall be held in December of each year for the purpose of receiving final reports of all officers and election of new officers from the nominations submitted in November. The results shall be announced at the Annual Banquet in January of each year.

### II. Special Meetings

Special meetings of The Club may be held upon call of either the President or the Board of Directors, or upon request of 20% of the Club members.

### ARTICLE XII

#### Publications

### I. Newsletter

The Club shall publish at regular monthly intervals a Club newsletter, Checkpoints. The newsletter shall cover topics of general interest to members of The Club.

### II. Other Publications

The Club shall, as necessary, distribute flyers, bulletins, etc., containing information concerning Club activities.

### III. Subscription Fees

All Club publications shall be furnished free to dues-paying members and to certain other interested individuals and organizations. All others (for example, non-members and life members, etc.) may be included on The Club's mailing list by payment of a \$2.00 annual subscription fee.

### TROPHY POINTS ACCUMULATION SYSTEM

### VII. EXCEPTIONS

Any competitive event of The Club may be exempt from these Trophy Points Accumulation standards, provided that:

- A. such exemption shall be approved by the Outdoor Activities Chairman, and
- B. the trophy system to be used shall be announced in all pre-event publicity.
