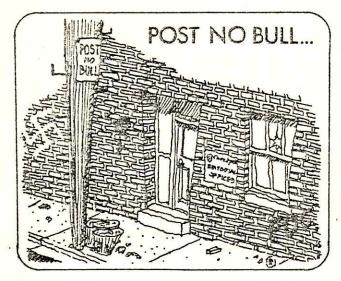

... TO START THE YEAR OFF.

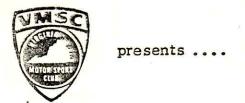

- 3. Change the last sentence of Section 7.3.2.c to read:

"No recaps are permitted, and the 2/32 inch tread depth indicating bands must not be visible over more than 50 percent of the tire tread width."

4. Add to Section 4.7 after the first sentence:

"However, in the case of multiple, abutting pylons, the penalty for displacing one or all of the pylons is two seconds."

5. Change Section 10.0 to read:

Change Section 11.c, third sentence, to read:

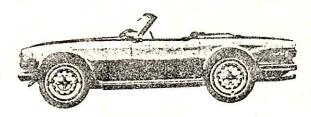
"In addition, event trophies will be awarded based on one (1) trophy for each five (5) entries or fraction thereof, up to a maximum of three (3) trophies."

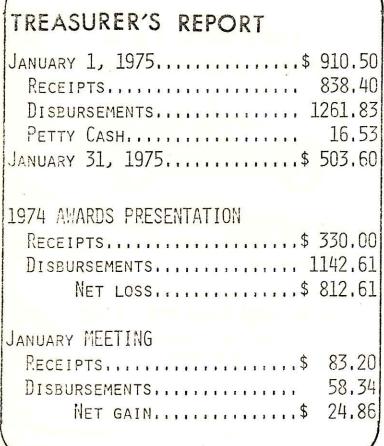

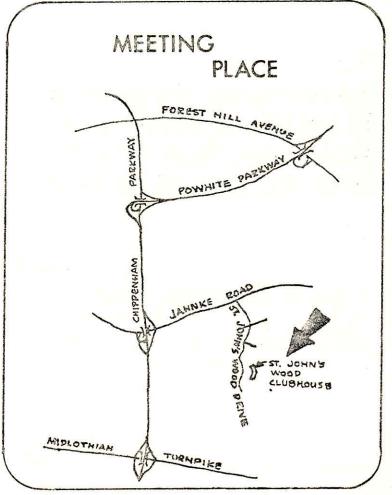

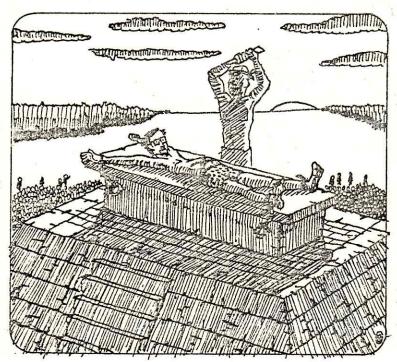
THOUGHTS ON PUTTING ON ONE'S FIRST RALLY

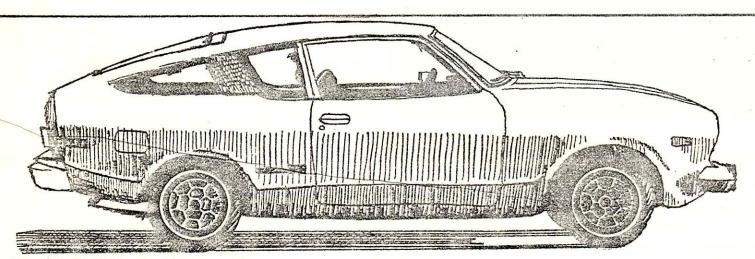
I have examined the statement of cash receipts and disbursements of the Virginia Motor Sport Club, Inc. for the years ended Docember 31, 1974 and 1973.

In my opinion the accompanying statement presents fairly the cash transactions of the club for the years 1974 and 1973.

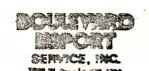

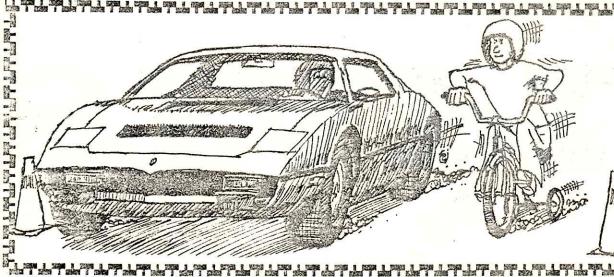

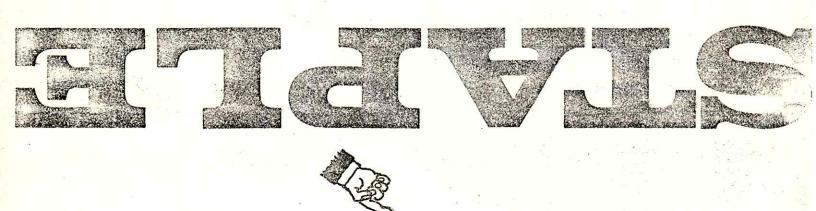
