KIDDING'S KORNER

The 1943 Dusenburgh 20

The 1943 Dusenburgh 20 was truly one of the lesser known fine racing machines. The car was brought into existence due to the rantings of Adolph Hitler (Dolph, to his friends) who, as the war was going badly, was determined to prove that Germany could win at something. To accomplish this goal Dolph (a shy quiet man with a great imagination, fanatical zeal, and a burning desire to win) called on the greatest automobile designer in all of Germany. Dr. Ferdinand Porch. (Ferd. to his friends)

Thus, on the morning of March 15th., 1943 the great
Dusenburgh 20 project began. Dolph, as usual, was in a hurry and
instructed Ferd to have the first prototype ready by April 15th.,
no matter what the cost. Dr. Ferd, being a man of immense
determination, said "No Way, Man" but grudgingly reconsidered
after Dolph explained to him that design engineers were desperately needed on the Russian front. (Ferd hated the cold because
ha had skipped the correspondence lesson on how to design an
effective automobile heater and did not want this fact known)

Calling upon all of his knowledge and a whole lot of his friends, Ferd attacked the problem with great vigor (and a truck full of beer) and on the afternoon of April 14th., 1943 the first of the unbelievable Dusenburgh 20's rolled out onto the test track at Nurburgring. (German for a whole hell of a lot of curves) Dolph was elated, even though the bill was for 172 million marks, and he ordered a test run to be made on the following

morning.

The car itself was absolutely amazing. The body design, which was contributed by Dr. Willie Von Braunstein, (no nickname) slightly resembled a rocket on wheels. The overall length of the car was 368 inches, but to improve cornering the car was hinged in the middle. It weighed a total of 7,328 pounds (empty) and had a ground clearance of 17 inches. The fuel capacity was 488 gallons which was due to the fact that the engine thrust used fuel at the rate of 2/10 of a mile per gallon. The engine was a fantastic V-20 triple overhead cam with a displacement of 11,264 cu.in. The compression ratio was 126:1 and with ten solex four barrel carbureators the engine developed a total of 3,187 horsepower at 19,460 r.p.m.'s. The drive train was a 7 speed manual transmission with gear ratios of 17.88:1 in first up to 2:1 in seventh. The car had eight Sempirite radial tires, disc brakes front, rear, and middle, and a turning radius of only 8 feet. (lock to lock was only 1½ turns due to the hinge in the middle)

The Dusenburgh 20's first real test began on the morning of April 15th. as Dolph, Ferd, and Willie looked on. Renouned German racing driver Wilheilm Klunker roared off the start line at 8 A.M. The car reached a speed of 73 m.p.h. in only 3.6 seconds in first gear and after rounding the first turn Wilheilm pushed the car to its limit and attained a speed of 397 m.p.h. in fifth gear as he

approached the back straight.

The only oversight made by Dr. Ferd was the use of front and rear spoilers and due to this, as the car reached its top speed of 555 m.p.h. it hit a bump in the track and became airborne.

While the amazed group of Germans watched, the car obtained an altitude of 10.950 feet, banked to the left, and disappeared

toward the North Atlantic never to be seen again.

Dolph was heartbroken but he had already decided to give it another go and was contemplating a Dusenburgh 30. Alas however, while in his secret design center at Bertchesgarden with his lovely secretary Eva Knevia Braun, some of the special racing fuel exploded and thus brought to a close an era of motor racing which was unexplainable lost until recently. (very recently)

In following articles, we will explore the world of automobile racing to depths never before known (understandable) and bring to light more great exploits that have been lost for generations because of the ineptness of preceeding experts.



GOOD BEGINNINGS

It seemed like even the weather was working for Bill & Shelia as they soloed as rallymasters on February's event. Their "Spirit of '76" attracted a remarkable entrance field of 40+ cars and a spectacular Sunday of clear blue skies. The rally had been billed as a fast and easy country drive through Hanover County, and it lived up to its advertising.

It was almost impossible to get off course. Most of the traps and all of the fun came from the delightfully brisk speeds. The rule of 40 mph on all 600 series and 45 mph on all 700 series roads, unless directed otherwise by an NRI, opened the way for a rapid succession of speed changes, depending on route number and instruction. That triangle will long be remembered. And the 45 mph swiftly deteriorating gravel road. And the ROAD CLOSED staring us sternly in the face. As well as the oh-no-not-again, infamous-from-last-year-yet intersection of 666 and 623, which triggered a mental block even in the heads of one Porsche's inhabitants.

Near as we can recall, the last rally we ran with as much mathematical manipulation of route digits was a December event by Peaseley & Whitehead. There was a 7-Up sign on that winter rally which we can't find yet! This combination of arithmetic and "unobtrusive" signs seems to have been popular back then. But we'll bet they didn't have to figure that $0 \times 1/3 = 0$. Or did they? Speaking of 7-Up signs, the "Scotchtown" series was a nice, simple, subtle trap. However, it perhaps would have tasted better if the emphasis had been on the habit-breaking route change alone.

The constant retracing of our path backwards and forwards and around the same roads was delightful, and it was especially enjoyable for cars early in the field. The roads themselves were local, scenic, and fun to drive. One could approach and leave intersections easily and quickly. So easily and quickly, as a matter of fact, that we wonder how many contestants will admit to turning left into 714.


Well, Bill & Shelia, now you've done it. You should be proud of your first. We're looking forward to your second.






The above map sections are from central Virginia counties and one town, can you name them?

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
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
