Lastly, we're not making use of our new members. You "old timers" make an effort to get to know them and make them feel welcome. You "new timers" get off your duffs and get involved. Volunteer to work on committees, etc. If you don't know what needs to be done in the club, ASK SOMEONE!!!

We have a new year coming. Let's use the last two months of this one to get to know our new members better, help them get more involved, and get involved ourselves. It sure would be a great way to start off the New Year!


Effective this issue
