



#### DASTARDLY DIGIT,

Our first big problem was caused by the weather. It was cold; the Porsche doesn't have a heater, and so we took Tom's "All ahead, SLOW" Oldsmobile. Knowing Barb and Wilt have BRISK speeds on all of their events, Tom insisted upon driving. This left me as our navigator, and that was our first mistake.

#### Dumb Ass Of The Year

Last year, at the Annual VMSC Awards Banquet, Mike Castleberry was presented with the "Dumb Ass of the Year" Award. Now, there is no doubt that Mike's outstanding achievement in the field of stupidity should have been acknowledged as such, but We feel that it in no way reflected a yearlong campaign required to attain such an award.

There has never been a truly quantitative means to measure and determine that one person whose stupidity has outshown all others. Until this year! We, the Editors of Checkpoints, have developed and refined a complex system by which an accurate determination can, at last, be made. Briefly, the system is comprised of two means for acquiring points: Three points are awarded for each D.A.M. nomination and two additional points are awarded for each D.A.M. Award won by that person. However, it is often the case that the most deserving D.A.M. nominee does not win the D.A.M. Award. This generally occurs whenever mob rule takes over at a club meeting and the nominations take on the visage of a public lynching. So to counteract this, We appointed Ourselves, Style Judges. Each of Us awards points from 0.0 to 6.0 (a system similar to that used in international diving and figure-skating competition). The Style points of the two judges are averaged and then added to the Nomination and Award points. Thus, the most points a person could logically expect to receive in one month is eleven or a maximum of 132 for the year. 


