DEAR ED.,

I WRITE YOU THIS LETTER IN HOPES THAT MY GRIEVANCE WILL BECOME BETTER KNOWN SO THAT SOMETHING CAN BE DONE.

THE MERITS OF A SPORTS COMPETITOR DURING A GAME ARE MEASURED BY HIS ACCOMPLISHMENTS. A RUNNING BACK IS MEASURED BY HOW MANY YARDS HE GAINS; A PITCHER BY HOW MANY STRIKEOUTS; A QUARTERBACK BY HOW MANY PASS COMPLETIONS. THE MORE STRIKEOUTS OR COMPLETIONS CAN ONLY ADD TO HIS ABILITY. THE RALLYIST, ON THE OTHER HAND, IS MEASURED BY THE POINTS AGAINST HIM. AS THE RALLYIST ACCUMULATES POINTS, HIS ABILITY LESSENS, WHICH LEADS TO MY HYPOTHESIS:

NO ONE WINS A RALLY. SOME JUST LOSE MORE THAN OTHERS.

THIS I FEEL IS DETRIMENTAL TO THE SPORT. FOR INTEREST TO SPREAD, WE MUST CONVEY THE MESSAGE OF HOW GOOD RALLYING IS AND NOT HOW BAD (QUESTION: HOW GOOD IS IT?). I OFFER THIS SOLUTION: CHANGE THE SCORING SYSTEM FROM PENALTY POINTS TO ACCOMPLISHMENT POINTS. THAT IS, THE HIGHEST SCORE WINS. A ZERO WOULD BE THE LEAST DESIRABLE SCORE. THIS SYSTEM WOULD ALSO LOWER THE COST OF BEING COMPETITIVE, BECAUSE A RALLY COMPUTER WOULD BE THE LEAST DESIRABLE OF EQUIPMENT: NOBODY WANTS A LOW SCORE.

YES, OF COURSE, THE CLASSING SYSTEM WOULD HAVE TO BE CHANGED. I PROPOSE THE FOLLOWING CLASSES:

EQUIPPED:

NEWS ITEM: HANCY MILLER BOSTON, MASS.

CHANGES TO THE SPEED EVENT REGULATIONS:

- 1. ADD SECTION 7.3.2 N: ANY TYPE IGNITION SYSTEM MAY BE USED WITH THE STOCK DISTRIBU-TOR, PROVIDING IGNITION TIMING IS WITHIN THE FACTORY SPECIFIED RANGE.
- 2. CHANGE SECTION 7.4.1 D TO: DISTRIBUTOR MAY BE INTERNALLY MODIFIED; VACUUM CONTROL MAY BE DISCONNECTED; DISTRIBUTOR ADJUSTMENT MAY BE MODIFIED.
- 3. CHANGE SECTION 7.4.1 P TO: INSIDE AND OUTSIDE FENDER LIPS MAY BE MODIFIED FOR TIRE CLEARANCE; SUSPENSION COMPONENTS (EXCEPT AS IN J ABOVE) MUST BE STOCK.


4. CHANGE SECTION 7.8, NEXT-TO-LAST SENTENCE, TO: ANY DRIVER MAY VOLUNTARILY PLACE HIS CAR IN A/M.

- 5. CHANGE SECTION 7.4.1 N TO: WHEELS MAY BE OF ANY MANUFACTURE, UP TO 1.5" WIDER THAN STOCK, AND THE TRACK MAY BE UP TO 1.5" WIDER THAN STOCK (OR UP TO 1.5" NARROWER THAN STOCK). V8 AMERICAN SEDANS AND SPORTY CARS AND SOLID AXLE CORVETTES ARE CONSIDERED STOCK WITH 7"-WIDE RIMS; OTHER CORVETTES ARE CONSIDERED STOCK WITH 8"-WIDE RIMS.
- CHANGE SECTION 7.6 BY DELETING: FORMULA CLASS.



Change the homologation scheme in the Competition Regulations, Section 9.0, TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

D/S \rightarrow F/P \rightarrow C/S \rightarrow E/P \rightarrow B/S \rightarrow D/P \rightarrow C/P \rightarrow A/S \rightarrow B/P \rightarrow A/P \rightarrow C/M \rightarrow B/M \rightarrow OR TO THE HIGHEST PREVIOUSLY HOMOLOGATED CLASS.






A paper-and-pencil game for 2, 3, or 4 players.

Object: To score the most points by winning—or by placing second—in as many of the eleven races as possible. Each player enters the various races according to the throw of the dice, and then advances toward each finish line by rethrowing the number of that race.

Equipment: One game sheet (see illustration), four dice, pencil for each player. Preliminaries: Each player throws the dice and the one with the highest total plays first. This player puts his initials at the top of the first column in the scoring area marked "Players." The next player (the person sitting to the left of the first player) places his initials at the top of the second column. And so on. In each race entered, a player will use the track that corresponds to his scoring column-that is, the first player will use the uppermost track in each race, the second player will use the track just below that, and so on. Play: A player throws the four dice when it is his turn. The player then divides them into two pairs in any manner he chooses. For each pair of dice, the player marks off one space on his track in the race corresponding to the total of the two dice. For example: a player throws 2-3-5-6. The player can mark off one space in race 5 (2+3) and one in race 11 (5+6), or one space in race 7 (2+5) and one in race 9 (3+6), or two spaces in race 8 (2+6 and 3+5). As races are finished, players may find that they are unable to use one or even both of their dice totals. Scoring: The player marking off the last space in a race has won that race. The winner of a race records the points for first place (higher number in the crossed flags at the end of the race) in his scoring column. If one or more of the other players has passed the double vertical line (which occurs in different positions in the various races), the one who is the farthest advanced scores the points for second place (lesser number in the crossed flags). In case of a tie, the playeramong those tying-in the lowest track (that is, the player who started later) wins the points. If no player has passed the double line at the time a race is won, there is no score for second place in that

race. Winning: When all eleven races have been completed, the player with the highest score is the winner. In case of a tie, the player—among those tying—whose scoring column is farthest to the right (who played later at the start of the game) is the winner.



Mini Car Causes Maxi Problems For Occupants

CLARKSVILLE - "You wouldn't have believed it!" stated Clarksville Police Chief Wayne Hogan as he described the spot where a small foreign car finally stopped last Sunday morning after a high-speed

Arrested and charged with

reckless driving, failure to stop for a police officer, felonious assault with a motor vehicle and resisiting arrest was 22year old Charles Wayne Irby of Halifax.

A passenger in the auto, 21year old Gary Rupert Holt of South Boston, was charged with

felonious assault, possession of an illegal weapon (91/2 inch knife) and resisting arrest. Both face preliminary hearings in General District Court on February 10. Irby was released on \$5,000 bond while Holt remains free on \$2,500 bond.

It all started Sunday morning around 12:40 a.m. when Chief Hogan, parked at Virginia Southern Bank, observed the small Honda auto pass another car in front of the Clarksville Post Office and speed through town heading west on Route 58.

Hogan said that he gave pursuit and approached the vehicle near the railroad trestle but when he attempted to pull alongside the auto, the driver swerved over into the passing lane in what he said was an effort to force the police cruiser off the road.

Hogan said that he made several more attempts to head the small car off while both vehicles approached speeds around 85 miles per nour.

Each time, according to Hogan, that he attempted to head the car off, the driver would swerve over into the

passing lane.

The subjects turned south on Route 49 and later turned on to Route 735 at Averett Church near Nelson. The driver proceeded some two miles down Route 735 before turning off and heading across fields and then into a wooded area some two miles from the highway.

Hogan said that he gave pursuit as far as he could until his cruiser could not longer manage the rough terrain.

By this time, Mecklenburg County Sheriff's Deputies Royster and Hinkle along with State Trooper Larry Bowman had joined in the pursuit.

Hogan said that the auto continued on through the woods an estimated half mile beyond the point where he was forced to end the auto chase. The officers took to foot and located the abandoned car but the occupants had fled the scene on

After a vain search of the area, the officers walked back to the point where their police cruisers were parked only to hear the little Honda off and running again.

The officers caught up with the auto but the occupants had locked all the doors and made several attempts to run down the police officers according to Hogan.


Trooper Bowman was said to have broke out one of the windows with his flashlight and finally halt the driver.

Hogan said that a wrecker crew had to use a power saw to cut their way to the location where the Honda auto located. The vehicle sustained extensive damage.

Hogan said that the vehicle, because of its front wheel drive, had managed to go places that his cruiser could not.
