### Members' Forum

TO THE EDITOR:

THE "HEART OF DINWIDDIE" CREATED SOME UNUSUAL (BUT NOT UNPRECEDENTED) DECISIONS. THE PROTEST COMMITTEE RULED TO DISCARD CONTROL #7 BUT SCORE CONTROL #8. NO PROVISION IN THE GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS OF PETER'S AND JUDY'S RALLY ALLOWED FOR THE POSSIBILITY OF DISCARDING A PARTICULAR CONTROL. THEREFORE, NO METHOD FOR AN EQUITABLE SCORING OF CONTROL #8 WAS SET OUT IN ADVANCE. THE RALLYMASTERS USED IN THEIR JUDGMENT A FAIR SCORING SYSTEM. SUCH IS REGARDED AS AN ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION.

ADMINISTRATIVE DECISIONS ARE WELL KNOWN TO OUR CLUB. I'M STRICTLY SPEAKING FROM MY OWN EXPERIENCE OF 7 YEARS WITH VMSC. WE HAVE BEEN BOTH HELPED AND HURT BY SUCH DECISIONS, BUT THAT'S NOT IMPORTANT HERE. WE REMEMBER ON ONE OF OUR OWN RALLIES, "A CROOKED MILE," THAT 2 CREWS FOUND ANOTHER WAY TO INTERPRET AN INSTRUCTION; 26 DID NOT, BUT 2 DID. OUR ANSWER WAS TO DISCARD THE CONTROL BECAUSE OF OUR OVERSIGHT. WE AGREED WITH THE MINORITY.


IN ANOTHER CLUB EVENT, ONE WHICH WE RAN, A SIGN CAME DOWN ON LEG 2. THE RALLYMASTERS THREW EVERYTHING UP TO THE LUNCH BREAK/REZERO POINT. WE DID NOT AGREE WITH THEIR DECISION, BUT WE HAD NO RECOURSE. ANOTHER INSTANCE INVOLVED A RALLY A COUPLE OF YEARS AGO THAT WE CHECKED. THE RALLY HAD 8 CONTROLS. A PROTEST ON LEG 5 WAS UPHELD BY THE PROTEST COMMITTEE, BUT 2 WEEKS AFTER THE EVENT THE RALLYMASTERS DISCARDED ALL CONTROLS AFTER THE ONE IN QUESTION — MUCH TO OUR DISMAY AND DISAGREEMENT.

WHEN MARIAN AND I WERE RELATIVELY NEW TO THIS CLUB, WE RAN A RALLY CALLED "THE MIND BENDER." THIS RALLY WAS UNIQUE. WE RAN AS CAR #1 BY DEFAULT AND DID NOT BECOME INVOLVED IN THE WRECKS THAT OCCURRED BEHIND US. THE RESULT WAS THAT WE HIT ALL 7 OR 8 CONTROLS. NO ONE ELSE FOUND ANYTHING EXCEPT CONTROLS #1 AND #2. THE RALLYMASTERS DISCARDED ALL CONTROLS AFTER #1 BECAUSE OF THE SNOW. OLDTIMERS KNOW THE PROBLEMS ON THIS EVENT. I THINK WE FINISHED 8TH OR 9TH WHEN WE THOUGHT WE HAD WON THE RALLY!

THE MAJOR POINT IN ALL THIS IS THAT THE RALLYMASTER HAS THE FINAL WORD. UNLESS VMSC WANTS TO PUT RESTRICTIONS ON RALLYMASTERS, SUCH POSSIBLY UN-FAVOURABLE SOLUTIONS WILL CONTINUE TO ARISE. I THINK THE MAJOR PROBLEM CENTERS AROUND THE QUESTION AS TO WHETHER THE RALLY, AFTER IT HAS BEEN RUN, REMAINS THE PROPERTY OF THE RALLYMASTER OR FALLS UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE COMPETITION COMMITTEE OR THE CLUB ITSELF.

THE SOLUTION TO THIS PROBLEM LIES WITH THE CLUB MEMBERS. IF WE ARE GOING TO LET RALLYMASTERS DO WHATEVER THEY WANT TO DO AFTER THE EVENT, THEN WE MUST LIVE WITH THEIR DECISIONS. WHY HAS VMSC NOT GIVEN THE RALLYMASTERS SOME GUIDELINES? WHY NOT A STANDARD SCORING SYSTEM? WHY NOT A SYSTEM TO DEAL WITH DISCARDED CONTROLS? IF THERE ARE NO WRITTEN RULES TO FOLLOW, THE RALLYMASTER IS IN CHARGE OF HIS EVENT, LIKE IT OR NOT.



## 2<sup>nd</sup> Opinion

VMSC COMPETITION COMMITTEE REPORT

The Heart of Dinwiddie Rally

April 23, 1978

The committee was comprised of Bookie Westbrook, Barbara Stout, Dave McCall, and Wilt Greenwood, with Dick Jones designated chairman by Fred DeBardeleben in his absence. During the consideration of a protest by Car #5, Bob Glotfelty was chosen to sit on the committee as an alternate for Wilt Greenwood.

Car #1 protested NI 57 and requested checkpoint 6 be discarded.

"57. Right onto a Route whose route number is higher than the route number of your current Route. CAS 30. Pause 0.50 minutes."

The term "route number", as defined by the generals, designated both the sign and the numerical designation of a route. At the intended execution point of NI 57, the protestors interpreted this to mean the sign and the numeric designation of the new route must both be "higher" than the sign and numeric designation of their current route. A majority of the committee felt that only one of the two items need be higher; since the sign for the new route (611) was physically higher on the pole than the sign for the current route (613), it fufilled the requirements of NI 57, and the protest was denied.

Car #5 protested NI 60 and requested checkpoints 7 & 9 be discarded.

"60. Straight at a non-existant road."

The protestors held that NI 60 presented the rallyist with several conflicting possibilities as to what constituted a non-existant road. The committee agreed that there was an ambiguity in this respect and the protest was upheld and checkpoint 7 was discarded. However, a majority of the committee felt it was possible for the rallyist to recover at this point and successfully arrive at checkpoint 8; therefore, checkpoint 3 was not discarded.


Report submitted by Dick Jones, Acting Chairman

Due to the Committee's decision regarding Control 7 and 9; the four cars (Cars #3, #5, #8, and #13) which missed Control 7 received a score for Control 9 equal to the arithmetic mean of their scores for the first six Controls.






