IF YOU CAN'T RUN A RALLY FOR WHICH YOU HAVE PRE-REGISTERED, YOU OWE IT TO THE RALLYMASTERS TO TRY TO CANCEL IN ADVANCE OR EXPLAIN AFTER THE FACT. IT IS BOTH RUDE AND UNSPORTSMANLIKE TO RESERVE A PLACE AND MERELY NOT ARRIVE AS EXPECTED. WHAT'S BEEN GOING ON? THERE'S AN UNPLEASANT TREND.


AND WHILE WE'RE ON THE SUBJECT OF UNPLEASANTNESS, I'D LIKE TO ASK WHY IT'S NECESSARY FOR CONTESTANTS TO PILE UNKIND ABUSE ON RALLYMASTERS AFTER AN EVENT IS OVER. I WATCHED AND LISTENED AND LATER WAS INFORMED ABOUT THE GO-INGS-ON AT THE END OF THE LAST RALLY. AND I WISHED FATHER PEASELEY WAS HERE TO PREACH A LITTLE ABOUT RALLY ETIQUETTE.


EVERY RALLYMASTER REALIZES THAT HE IS NOT GOING TO PLEASE ALL CONTESTANTS. BUT NO RALLYMASTER EXPECTS LOUD VERBAL ABUSE FROM THE DISSATISFIED CREWS. IF THERE IS A TECHNICAL POINT TO CONTEST, THEN FILE A FORMAL PROTEST. IF THERE IS A QUESTIONABLE POINT, THEN DISCUSS IT WITH THOSE IN CHARGE. IF THERE IS SOMETHING YOU SIMPLY DON'T LIKE, THEN TELL THE RALLYMASTERS. BUT ALL THIS CAN BE DONE WITHOUT BECOMING VILE AND VENGEFUL.

THE WORST THING ABOUT THE MAY RALLY WAS THAT THE MOST FOUL COMMENTS WERE DIRECTED TO NOVICE RALLYMASTERS BY HARDENED, WELL-EXPERIENCED CONTESTANTS. AND IT WAS UNCALLED FOR. IF SUCH A TIRADE COULD NOT BE CONTAINED, THEN PRESENCE OF MIND SHOULD HAVE TOLD THE COMPLAINERS TO ATTACK THE MUCH MORE EXPERIENCED CHECKERS.

WE SHOULD REMEMBER THAT OUR SKIN IS THICK ONLY WHEN WE'RE ON THE GIVING END OF ABUSE. IT IS A THANKLESS EFFORT TO PUT ON A RALLY FOR THE MOST PART. COUPLE THIS WITH THE ABUSIVE OUTCRIES FROM TIRED CONTESTANTS AND IT IS NO WONDER THAT RALLYMASTERS ARE BECOMING INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT TO RECRUIT. WHO WANTS IT?

THE CONTESTANTS ARGUED THAT THE SAME PORTION OF THE COURSE HAD BEEN ENCOUNTERED EARLIER IN THE RALLY (BUT FROM A DIFFERENT DIRECTION) AND WAS DEPICTED AS FOLLOWS:

THEY THEREFORE FELT THAT, IF THE RALLYMASTER
CONSIDERED THIS ROAD CONFIGURATION TO BE ONE
INTERSECTION THE FIRST TIME THROUGH THAT
PORTION OF THE COURSE, THEN THIS PORTION OF
THE COURSE, ALTHOUGH APPROACHED FROM ANOTHER DIRECTION, WOULD HAVE TO BE CONSIDERED ONE INTERSECTION EACH TIME. THE PROTEST WAS UPHELD AND CONTROL #4

SIDERED ONE INTERSECTION <u>EACH</u> TIME. THE PROTEST WAS UPHELD AND CONTROL #4 DISCARDED.

CAR #6 PROTESTED THE FOLLOWING STICK MAP INSTRUCTION ON MAP 7:

THE CONTESTANTS FELT THAT THE ACTUAL ROAD CONFIGURATION WAS DIFFERENT FROM THAT DEPICTED IN THE STICK MAP, AND THAT TWO INTERSECTIONS WERE INVOLVED RATHER THAN ONLY ONE. THUS, THEY FELT THAT YOU COULD NOT PUT TWO ROADS TO YOUR LEFT AT THAT POINT.





Engine supports a high speed bike

Motorbike speed freaks might take heart from a development in design pioneered by 36-year-old French engineer and racing driver Andre de Cortanze. He became concerned that motorcycle speeds were often held down by the machine's centre of gravity being too high, meaning that corners have to be taken relatively slowly. Backed by the petroleum company ELF, he designed the bike, shown here, in which the orthodox frame has been omitted. Instead the machine is held together by the 750 cc engine. The result is that the centre of gravity is significantly lower than on ordinary motorbikes—for instance the fuel tank is slung beneath the engine and 17 cm lower than normal. Whether or not the theory works will be shown in trials due to start by the end of the year. De Cortanze plans to take the bike to the racetrack soon afterwards.

State of Confusion: Find the eight lost towns

Reproduced at right is the official, albeit abridged, roadmap of the State of Confusion. Situated, presumably, in the Middle West—where everything happens in neat, orderly rows—Confusion is six miles square, and thus each box on the grid is one mile on a side. There are ten towns in Confusion (lettered A through J):

A. Birdsnest B. Braggadocio C. Cornstalk D. Eek

E. Loveladies


F. Meddybemps
G. Niceville
H. Weeping Water
I. Wink
J. Zap

Braggadocio (the state capital) and Niceville (the cultural center) are world-famous and so are already shown on the map. But the locations of the other eight towns have been entirely forgotten by the bigwigs at the state highway department. Hoping to save face in an election year, they've ordered a new set of highway signs (lettered K through T and shown at lower right).

But this has only made matters worse, for no one knows where to erect the signs. It is known that each of the eight "lost" towns is located at one of the 18 highway junctions or intersections (circled on map), and that each of the road signs was designed to go at one of the remaining ten junctions or intersections (and indicates the number of miles from that spot to the designated towns). Thus, on the completed map every junction and intersection will be marked by either a "lost" town or a road sign. The highways are shown in black, and all mileages are calculated by the shortest possible highway route (not via the gray background grid and not "as the crow flies"). Help the bigwigs stay in power. Locate all the towns and signs on the map. It won't be easy. Logic will take you part of the way, but at some point you'll have to resort to trial and error. If you get Confused, there's a hint (Peeking is allowed.)



CAR #7 REQUESTED THE COMPETITION COMMITTEE TO DIRECT THE RALLYMASTERS OF THE APRIL RALLY TO RESCORE CHECKPOINT #8. THE CREW IN QUESTION HAD MISSED CHECKPOINT #7 (LATER DISCARDED) AND FELT THEY SHOULD HAVE BEEN SCORED ON LEG 8 BY THE COMBINED OET'S OF LEGS 7 AND 8.

THE GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS, HOWEVER, HAD NO PROVISION FOR SCORING IN THE EVENT A CONTROL WAS DISCARDED.

THEREFORE, THE COMPETITION COMMITTEE FELT THAT THE METHOD OF SCORING WAS AN ADMINISTRATIVE DECISION MADE TO COVER AN UNFORSEEN OCCURRENCE. SINCE IT WAS QUESTIONABLE AS TO WHETHER AN OET FOR AN INCORRECT/DISCARDED LEG COULD BE USED FOR SUBSEQUENT SCORING, THE COMPETITION COMMITTEE RULED THAT THE RALLY-MASTERS WERE WITHIN THEIR RIGHTS.

THE COMPETITION COMMITTEE STRONGLY SUGGESTS THAT ALL FUTURE RALLYMASTERS REMEMBER THIS PROBLEM AND MAKE AN ATTEMPT TO SOLVE IT IN ADVANCE.




