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
WHO'S NEW

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

For three days in May and June, all roads will lead to the State Fairgrounds in Richmond, Virginia as the Virginia Motor Sport Club presents the 5th Annual Series 3 Roadcross. The excellent event administration and the wide open course layout over the mile of paved midway roads has made "Series 3" the most popular event in central Virginia.

Registration must unfortunately be limited to 150 cars. Additional entries may be permitted depending on available daylight, but only on a first come, first served basis on each day of the event. Preregistration prior to May 1 should gaurantee you a chance to compete, and reserves you the same number for all three events.

Register for all three events for \$18.00 or individual events for \$7.00 each. Runs rain or shine with registration and tech inspection opening at 7:30 AM, first heat runs at 8:30 AM. MWCSCC class system. Exhaust suppression required in stock and prepared classes. Camber compensation required on all swing axle cars. SCCA approved rollover protection required on all open top cars. Points will be given for each event as follows: 9 points, 1st place; 6, 2nd; 4, 3rd; 3, 4th; 2, 5th; 1, 6th. One trophy will be awarded for each four cars (average) or fraction thereof in class; five trophies per class maximum.

Wile we cannot guarantee your choice of numbers, we'll do our best to comply. The sooner you register, the closer we can come to your preference.


