



THE TYPICAL EBERHARD RALLYE

Announcements by the pre-checker at the August membership meeting said the August "Southside 100" rallye, OD'ed by Chuck Hoezel and Gerry Eberhard, was a "typical Eberhard rallye". My navigator, Janice Wimmer, and I had never before run a "typical Eberhard rallye". In fact, no one had ever before run a "typical Eberhard rallye" because Gerry had never OD'ed a rallye till now.

Janice and I had only rallyed together once before about a year ago and that wasn't a "typical Eberhard rallye". We just glimpsed at the Generals on the night before the day of the rallye as I had just returned for the great state that's "high in the middle and round on the ends" that same day.

Since Janice and I were running the "typical Eberhard rallye" just for fun and basically just wanted to stay on course, we entered the "Seat of the Pants" class. The first trap of the "typical Eberhard rallye" was to run out the free zone at the end of the ODO leg (which we did) and not to miss the triangle (which we didn't). However, due to a light foot on my part, we were 46 hundreths late for the first leg of this "typical Eberhard rallye". For the second leg of this "typical Eberhard rallye", we did not miss the "STOP" placed in the middle of nowhere, but did miss the CAS on the leg 1 slip, did cross Rt. 60 twice, but due to incorrect calculation of mileage correction causing us to miss the NRC mileage, we came into the control backwards giving us close to a max. On legs 3 and 4 of the typical Eberhard rallye" we caught the CAS from the leg slips and did nicely with a 28 and our very first O!! Janice and I did just fine for the rest of the day on this "typical Eberhard rallye" with a 66, 0 (what? our second 0?!!), 2,38, and 74. Traps on legs 6 thru 9 of this "typical Eberhard rallye" were varied, with a "turn onto a route that's higher than your present route" and a "turn after 'Eggleston'" of which there were three signs.

When Janice and I got back from running our first "typical Eberhard rallye" we found one team had scored just one point lower than us, but since leg 5 was thrown (because of local interference), we wound up first in class, first in UE, and second overall. In general, this "typical Eberhard rallye" was a super effort and we want to see andother from Gerry and Chuck.




"OLD DOMINION RALLY"
