

The Following Changes to the VMSC Competition Regulations were passed by the Competition Committee and the Board of Directors.

- Page 4, Section 7: Delete in its entirety.
 Page 4, Section 7: Add new section reading:
 - "7. VEHICLE SAFETY

 Each competing car must have a valid inspection sticker,
 if required by the State of Registry. Contestants assume
 full responsibility for the condition of their vehicles.
 Any obvious safety defect(s) may result in that vehicle
 being barred from competition until such defect(s) has
 been corrected.
- Page 9, Section 12, Paragraph C, Sub-paragraph 4): Delete in its entirety.
- Page 9, Section 12, Paragraph C, Sub-paragraph 4): Add new Subparagraph reading:
 - "4) Once a Rookie rallyist has competed in the Equipped Class And/Or Unequipped Class in more than two (2) VMSC Sanctioned TSD Rallies having a specific Rookie Class, he or she is no longer eligible to compete in the Rookie Class."

The Following Changes to the VMSC Competition Regulations were passed by the Competition Committee and the Board of Directors and becomes effective January 1, 1983.

- Page 10, Section 14, Paragraph C, last sentence: Delete in its entirety.
- 6) Page 10, Section 14, Paragraph C. last sentence: Add new last sentence reading:

"At this point the remaining Rookie CER Scores shall be reduced by 10% and then averaged in with the other remaining CER Scores to produce the CER Average for the rally."

Competition Committee Report concerning the protests of the "Zero Battle" rally.

(I) A protest was filed on Leg 3, was upheld by the Committee, and leg 3 was discarded.

The protest concerned itself with whether or not an instruction referencing a SOD (R onto a route whose SOD is less than 15) could be executed onto a route with a one digit SOD.

The Generals stated that "A SOD (Sum of the Digits) consists solely of digits; not zeroes." The Generals also stated that "A digit is one of the whole numbers 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8, or 9."

The Committee decided that a SOD could be a one digit number for several different reasons. First; the statement that "A SOD consists solely of digits; not zeroes." could easily be interpreted several ways.

A SOD may contain one zero, but not more than one zero.
 A SOD can not contain any zeroes, only one or more of the

whole numbers used to define a digit.
Second; the use of the word "digits" (plural) in the SOD statement does not exclude the singular, in a generic sense.

Example: A statement in a set of Generals saying "driveways (plural) are to be considered nonexistent", does not mean that a single driveway somewhere along the rally course can indeed be used. Third: If O.D.'s intend to base a trap on grammar, then they must be both grammatically consistent throughout their Generals and grammatically correct throughout their Generals. The Committee felt that the "Zero Battle" Generals did not meet either of these conditions, much less both of them.

(II) A protest was filed on Leg 4 and was denied by the Committee.

The protest concerned itself with an intersection reading, "Left prior to the "Next Intersection". CAS 29." The contestants felt that a warning sign erected by the 0.0.'s and reading " "Next Intersection" sign, 1.6 miles ahead" had no status in connection with the proper execution of the instruction in question.

The Committee decided that this sign was legal. The Generals state "Official mileages are measured to the nearest hundredth of a mile." The Generals do not state that all mileages will be official nor do they state that official mileages will be given in hundredths.

The Committee further decided that since the Generals state "Information enclosed in quotation marks in the route instructions is taken from signs.", And "LI's must be executed------ at the first valid opportunity to do so.", And that since it is standard rally practice to turn towards or away from an object without actually having to see the object, then the contestants could turn away from a sign without actually having to see the sign. The Committee felt that using The "Zero Battle" Generals the contestants should have executed the instruction in question at the first Left turn encountered.

The Committee feels that the precedence set by this type of trap is in poor taste and should be discouraged in future events. The Committee hereby goes on record as requesting that future O.D.'s, Pre-checkers, and the 2nd Vice- President see to it that Generals require all signs to be visible from the rally course.

(III) A protest was filed concerning the intended method of scoring proposed by the O.D.'s at the finish. The protest was upheld and the O.D's were advised to score the rally in accordance with Section VI of their Generals.

The protest concerned itself with the intention of the O.D.'s to take any zeroes received by a contestant at a control and convert them to fives as per Section XI of the Generals.

The Committee decided that to do this would not be consistent within the Generals themself for several reasons.

1) Section VI states "Up to 2 minutes early or late at a control-1 point per hundredth of a minute" Converting a 0,10,100, etc. to

a 5,15,155, etc. is in variance with stated penalty.

2) Converting a score received in conjunction with Section VI to something else per Section XI is giving one part of the Generals priority over another part, when they are actually equal.

The Committee also decided that changing the earned scores for whatever reason is in violation of the VMSC Competition Regulations. Section 4, Paragraph B.

I feel that for any O.D. to tamper with the earned score of any contestant is in very poor taste. We rallyists spend much time. effort, and money trying to achieve the ultimate low score in a rally, Zero. Having our hard work taken away, for whatever reason, seems grossly unfair. I, as a contestant, would like to strongly urge future O.D.'s to please leave the earned scores alone.



ONE EDITOR'S OPINION


The Competition Committee and the Board of Directors passed three changes to the Competition Regulations which are published in this issue.

In the effort to avoid any implied liability, the Regs. were changed to read that "Any obvious safety defect (s) may result in that vehicle being barred from competition ..." But what is an obvious safety defect? Is it a blinding day-glow pink paint job or possibly a missing rear view mirror? What about an obvious safety defect that shows up in the middle of an event?

As far as changing the CER scoring, I have been saying for years that the easy rallies stand first in line for Rally of the Year. But rather than trying to make the completion of CERs mandatory for competive points of any rally, the Competition Committee and the Board of Directors decided to reduce the Rookies CER scores by 10%. This means that the Rookies opinion is 10% less important than the Equipped or Unequipped Rallyist. This opens the door for a little score juggling by the OD's. Oh well......


