




Our savior for the rally, however, was a navigator who was good at recordkeeping. One missed right or left could wreck your whole day.


Says something about your car when you can't figure out which dent is the new one.

Exhaust suppression required for all stock and prepared cars, camber compensation required for all swing axle cars, rollover protection required for all open top cars, and 1 3/4" minimum ground clearance required. Scoring will be based on the Best Time out of two runs on Saturday added to the Best Time out of three runs on Sunday.

There was a protest on Control 5 which the competition committee denied. The Rallymasters at this time administrativly discarded the leg because the purpose of the trap was not to see who could turn around the fastest...we gave y'all an even break.

#### JULY RALLY REPORT

One always approaches a rally in which generals are given out at on the day of the event with a certain amount of trepidation (why, the last time this was done the rallymaster tried to sleep through the event - are you listening, Castleberry?). Upon receiving said generals, we noted several errors and decided that we'd just run loose. This thinking proved to be a fatal error, both for the contestants and the rally.

The concept was simple enough, alternate lefts and rights based on the last digit of the route number, except where superceded by an instruction or a non-existent road. The only glitch occured on the last leg when the contestants should have made an obvious right only to be confronted with two YFU signs. Beat feet to the only other alternative. Sure enough the generals confirmed this fact, but in a rally that one had to assume so much before running, it didn't seem particularly apropos.

The leg was protested, the protest denied, and the leg was discarded - it doesn't make sense when you read it, but that's how it happened - we just report the news here at <a href="Checkpoints">Checkpoints</a>.

At the camping area, there was free beer - we pain with our blood on leg 5 - except for Dick who became quite distraught when he ran out of my Collins mixer "I ain't going to mix no Vodka with no zshinzsher - gimme a Dew!" He also had me looking for a new rally partner when he decided to take the boat and conduct amphibious operations in the lake. Dick may have a lot of talent, but he swims like an anchor. Competition Committee Report Concerning the Protest of The "You do it" Rally.

A Protest was filed on Leg 5 and was denied by the Committee.

The Protest concerned itself with whether the O.D.'s definition of a "Y.F.U." Sign could be interperted as "You Fouled Up" and thereby prevent the contestants from entering Control 5 from the intended direction.

The O.D.'s defined Y.F.U. as "You F \_\_\_ d Up", without further explanation, and the Generals stated that an example would be displayed at the start.

The Committee decided that the contestants could not assume the missing letters spelled out the word "Fouled", and that since the Generals did not say that the contestants would see a Y.F.U. Sign or what the contestants should do if they did indeed encountered a Y.F.U. Sign, then a Y.F.U. Sign was nothing more than a pie plate (as per the sample displayed at the start) and had no other meaning. The Committee also decided that those contestants who strayed from the correct course and used a Y.F.U. Sign to return to the proper course, did so incorrectly per the Generals in question.

The definition of Y.F.U. as used in other rallyes or as per "Standard" rally usage and the question as to the O.D.'s intent that one control determine the rally's outcome based on how quickly a contestant recovered, were deemed irrelevant.

The Committee does however, wish to go on record as being against using Y.F.U. Signs and/or Emergency Signs for trap purposes. The "normal" usage of these signs is to keep contestants from traveling too far off course and trying to recover by traveling at unsafe speeds, or to circumvent a problem area, or as a tool of the O.D. to eliminate certain roads from consideration by the contestants. The Committee feels that contestants, O.D.'s, and even the club, place too much significance on these signs, as per their original intention, to have them used unwisely.
