



The Symptom that Hurts

With the weather changing so frequently, I imagine more than a few of us are fighting with lingering colds or maybe even the flu. We mumble along, business as usual, until we feel so bad that our normal functioning is impaired. Then we decide to confront the problem by going to the doctor or staying home from work. The symptom that causes us to act to meet the problem could be called the "symptom that hurts." The symptom will generally recur, unless we treat the illness that is its cause.

For VMSC, the symptom that hurts is usually called "financial crisis." The club dawdles along behind the status-quo until a financial crisis makes it feel so bad that it appoints emergency committees to treat the symptom. Money is raised, the symptom remits, and the illness is ignored until the cycle resumes.

Declining revenues are the most blatant indicator that people are losing interest in VMSC. Losses on events mean fewer people are showing up at events. Losses on drink sales indicate people are not coming to meetings. Near-non-quorems at board meetings show that officers are losing interest in their jobs (not Positions, JOBS.)

Why are YOU losing interest in the club? Think about it! Then do something, say something, or suggest something to make our activities more interesting to you. This club consumes your leisure time. Make it so you get a good return on your investment!

Let's look at a typical meeting. Beginning: people milling, mixing, talking, smiling, enjoying themselves. Meeting comes to order: people conducting business, suggesting, presenting, ridiculing, arguing, playing games with Robert's Rules, enjoying themselves. Indoor activies portion: people whispering, ignoring the program, buying beer, wandering around, being annoyed, waiting patiently or not-so-patiently to do what they did when they first arrived, and definitely not enjoying themselves.

Barbara Parsley has busted her tail to do a job that she told us she had no time for when she agreed to help Ted Heller with it in January. It is a credit to her effort and perseverence that Indoor Activities works at all. However, the evidence suggests that there is little or no interest in organized programs at VMSC meetings.

POSSIBLE RESPONSE: Eliminate Indoor Activities (Board position and at meetings) and just sell beer to the happy socializers.

BETTER: Get out of the beer business and adjourn to a local pub, etc.

ANOTHER SUGGESTION: Find a smaller room for meetings, prefferably in the same facility. Less room to wander around will make the meetings more cohesive and productive, as our meeting in the Library earlier this year proved.

'Nuff said. Now let the sparks fly!






