

It's obvious from reading our infamous $\frac{Checkpoints}{even learned}$ that the Club is in terrible financial straits. I've $\frac{Checkpoints}{even learned}$ that one gigantic committee was formed to find out new ways to get more money!

Marian and I still get the SCCA Road Rally Newsletter, which had a report recently on an SCCA-sanctioned rally with an entry fee of \$5,000 and a winner-take-all pot of \$100,000. That rally drew 70 cars. You don't have to have an MBA to see that one hell of a lot of money was left over for "expenses." The report reminded us of the "Cash Dash" put on a few years back by VMSC's Dick Jones and Rob DeBardeleben.


We wish to propose a similar event on a somewhat smaller scale than $\ensuremath{\mathsf{SCCA}}\xspace's$:

- 1. Rallymasters -- DeBardelebens and Greenwoods
- 2. Prize -- \$5,000, winner-take-all
- 3. Entry Fee -- \$100/car
- 4. Limit -- 70 cars
- Social -- Cocktail party at end of rally for workers and contestants combined.

The rally would be about 200 miles and TSD. There would have to be a large protest fee (\$50?). There would have to be course marshalls located at hidden locations along the route to disqualify contestants for unsportsmanlike conduct, e.g., spreading nails on the road, shooting out tires, etc. There would be no restrictions on equipment -- rally equipment, that is. We might want to require a weapons check though!

The entire Club would have to get involved. This type of event would need heavy publicity well in advance of the date, and I expect that it will draw mostly out-of-state cars. Is there any interest?

The meal will be barbeque, cole slaw, potato salad, sliced tomatoes, iced tea, and pound cake. This is the best buy in the area and your money will support a good cause. Include the amount for your meal tickets with your entry fee (we must advise them of the number of meals required).

The Ladies Auxiliary of the Crewe Fire Department will be at the hanger on Saturday and Sunday with coffee, pastries, sandwiches and drinks available for purchase.

Blackst Championship Autocross II will be a simple fast course with no walk-throughs or drive throughs. This will be the same 2 mile course as last years, conditions permitting. Car numbers will be assigned by a drawing on Sept. 14th(there will be allowances for multiple driver cars). It will be run using MWCSCC Classes as amended by VMSC. Exhaust suppression required for all stock and prepared cars, camber compensation required for all swing axle cars, rollover protection required for all open top cars, and 1 3/4" minimum ground clearance required. Scoring will be based on the Best Time out of two runs on Saturday added to the Best Time out of three runs on Sunday.

For VMSC members this event will count as two events for Points, and one event for Trophies.




