



ROLL OR SPIN?

To the neophyte autocrosser, the specter of a rollover is perhaps the most difficult fear to overcome. In an autocross he must ignore most of the vehicle control "danger signals" he has been taught and press his vehicle to the limits of adhesion and suspension travel. The question all autocrossers eventually ask is, " Will it spin or will it roll?"

Starting with mathematical definitions of friction, cornering

Starting with mathematical definitions of friction, cornering force, and force couples about the car's center of mass, derivations we have no space to print will provide us with the following relation:

 $G = \frac{t}{2h}$

Where; G= "cornering force" in gravities t= vehicle track in any unit h= height of vehicle center of gravity (CG) in the same unit as chosen for "t"

"G" represents the chassis' "roll/spin boundary" of tire adhesion, or the amount of lateral acceleration in gravities where the car will lift both inside wheels in a curve. If G is greater than the cornering force of which the car is capable, the car will spin. If G is less than that amount, the car will roll as the limits of its cornering power are reached.

For a Datsun 510, the equation applies as follows:

t = 50.4 in. h = approx. 20 in. $G = \frac{50.4}{2(20)} = \frac{50.4}{40} = 1.26$ g's

Since high-dollar racing sedans are presently struggling to generate about 1.05 g's, it appears that, even with racing tires, the 510 will not stick well enough to roll without help from another source.

Why, then, do cars occasionally roll? Hitting an object like a

Why, then, do cars occasionally roll? Hitting an object like a curb with the outside wheel causes the effective tire adhesion to become infinite, and this can cause a rollover. In the case of front-wheel-drive cars using transverse engines (large "h" value) and racing tires, rollovers can occur if sudden, large steering inputs are made. This is more likely to occur if the suspension is softly sprung, because stiff springing causes the tire contact patch to be disturbed under abrupt steering, thus reducing the tires' grip and the car's lateral acceleration, preventing the rollover. In the case of swing-axle-suspended cars, a combination of rear-wheel tuck-under (reducing "t" and increasing "h" simultaneously) and under-inflated tires rolling off of asphalt-digging rims causes such hazards as rollovers and nagging consumer advocates (remember the 'Vair.)

So, will your car roll? In most autocrossing situations, probably not. However, one way to insure this (and go faster, too) is to make all your steering inputs smoothly and deliberately. If you work really hard at causing a disaster, the laws of physics always seem to find a way to help.

THE VIRGINIA MOTOR SPORT CLUB WILL CONDUCT A CHAMPIONSHIP RALLY SERIES DURING THE 1984 EVENT YEAR. THIS SERIES WILL BE OPEN TO BOTH MEMBERS AND NON-MEMBERS WITH POINTS BEING AWARDED FOR EACH EVENT, TOTALLY SEPARATE FROM OUR YEAR-END POINTS CHAMPIONSHIP. 
