The second Crewe autocross will be a challenging, high speed, two-day event run on the  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile airfield at Crewe, Virginia.

Registration will be limited to 80 cars. Pre-registration prior to May 6 is recommended to guarantee you the same number both days. Register for both events for \$16.00, or individual events for \$9.00 each. Dash plaques will be given to all entrants and workers. The autocross runs rain or shine, with registration & tech inspection opening at 10:00 a.m. Saturday and 9:00 a.m. Sunday.
