- JUN 6 VMSC Board Meeting at Gary Stout's (this is Our annual "Let's-not-have-a-quorum-at-Stout's" board meeting).





EXCLUSIVE Checkpoints ROAD TEST

Not since the invention of the wheel (which led logically to the invention of the flat tire) has the motoring world been set on its ear like it has been since NASA got into the production of automobiles. Everyone is familiar with the humble beginnings but its still worth dwelling on for awhile. The Lunar Rover LEV GTS was NASA's first plunge into the realm of limited production, high quality transportation. It was a commendable effort but suffered from the usual pitfalls encountered by a manufacturer entering the high-charged, stratified atmosphere that is domina-


ted by names like Ferrari and Rolls Royce: it carried an inflated sticker price (about \$8,000,000); the only models available were used (and abused) by employees; there was only one remotely-located dealership; and the car was sadly lacking in performance and certain other amenities We've come to expect in the cars We buy (NASA was, however, years ahead of everyone else in seeing America's longing for the return of the convertible).

That was years ago and in the meantime NASA has had to weather budget cuts and layoffs but has never taken its eyes off the future. NASA managed to retain all of its key R&D automotive personnel and their efforts have finally borne fruit - the subject of this road test, the 1986 Stealth GT.

Rumors of a new model have been heard for quite sometime and even We had become a bit skeptical about their validity. But the wait was worthwile, for what NASA has presented Us with is a state-of-the-art, hi-tech grand touring car of the first order. A car that can cruise at speeds of 160 mph with virtual diplomatic immunity. The price may, at first, seem a bit steep (\$169,874.98 fully optioned) until one realizes the cost of a fine for speeds like this is twenty to life. The Stealth may be a true automotive bargain.

The Stealth presents the observer with a mixed bag of sensations. Its clean, uncluttered lines, free of chrome and stylistic geegaws, leave one tranquil and ill-prepared for the savage and primal beast that lies harn-

essed under the expansive hood. Beneath the aerodynamic veneer beats the heart of an honest-to-God V-16 engine that displaces just shy of 10 liters (We laud NASA for avoiding the usual "slap-on-a-turbo-and-watch-it-go" technique employed by lesser manufacturers). This powerplant generates 850 bhp at 7500 rpm and 1100 ft-1b of torque at 4000 rpm - enough to quicken the pulse of a dead man. This megapower is delivered earthward via massive 465/20 VR 22 tires (365/30 VR 18 tires shod the front end) and yields almost mind-numbing performance figures (i.e. 0 - 60 in 2.2 sec; 1.621 g on the skidpad; 98.3 mph through the slalom). You don't exactly accelerate the Stealth, you merely rip the macadam away.



The GT's taut suspension makes short work of the slalom with small lean angles.


ine interior seemed a bit cramped and overinstrumented until NASA informed us, that due to production deadlines, they just welded the guts of an old Gemini space capsule in place and - voilà, a two-seater! We must admit that the instrumentation is complete and thorough, why there's even a read out for the heart rate of the driver! See if you can find that on your Maserati! In addition the absence of warning lights was a refreshing change of pace (Houston calls you if anything is wrong).

On the road, the Stealth won't turn many heads - but then that was NASA's intent. During one acceleration run on I-95, We went through radar at an indicated 218 mph with nary a blink from the local constabulary.

One of the car's draw-

backs presented itself the day We went shopping at Regency Square. Your noble Editors received many a curious stare as We went around throwing talcum powder into every vacant parking space. This is a minor complaint - talcum powder is cheap.

There was one truly unsettling feature to the Stealth; as it is invisible to radar, it is also invisible to other motorists!!! The picture below shows all the remained of Our test car shortly after We discovered this fact. We can only hope NASA will remedy this little problem before too many cars are sold, or it could end up like the legendary Subaru 360 Deluxe - banned in all states.
