COMPETITION REGULATIONS

4.0 CLASSES, AWARDS, POINTS and DEFINITIONS

4.1

VMSC Year-End Awards shall only be made to dues paying members in the following categories:

4.1 A

Fifty (50) points ... Awards Banquet.

Accumulation of VMSC competition points shall begin only after dues have been paid and the person has been accepted in good standing. Dues shall be considered paid for the entire year if received by February 1 or 30 days after billing date, whichever is later.

BYLAWS
ARTICLE IV

Dues

I. Annual dues ... January 1.

Life members who are active, by definition of article III section IV above, shall continue to pay dues as outlined above.

ARTICLE V

(Changed in it's entirety)

An initiation fee of \$25.00 will be charged to all new members.

For members in arrears past February 1 or 60 days after billing date, whichever is later, a \$10.00 re-initiation fee will be charged.

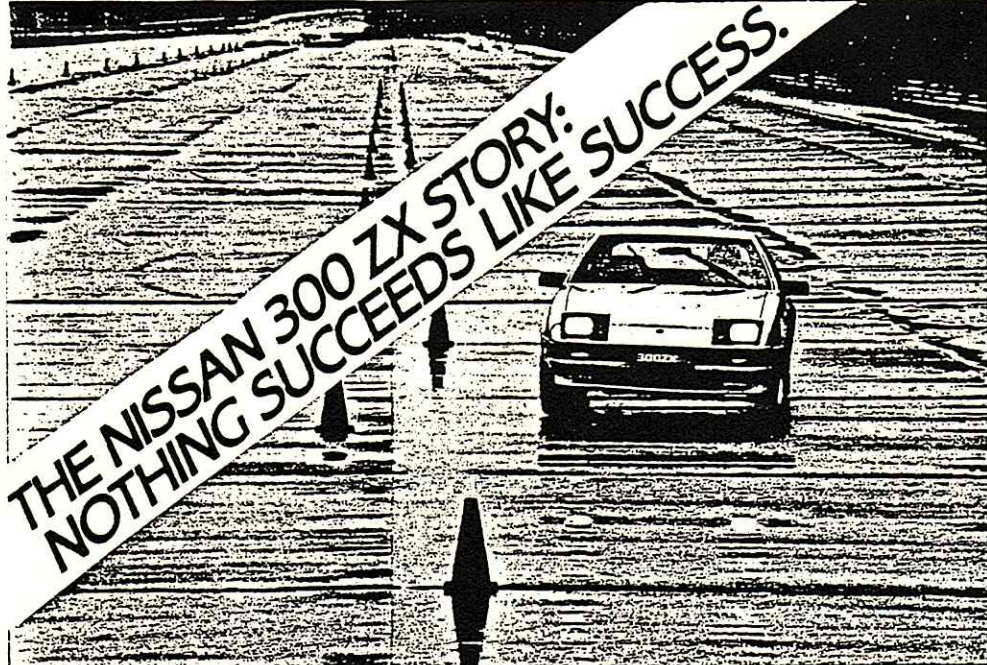
AN EDITORIAL

When We undertook the positions of Checkpoints Editors We vowed to remain apolitical on Club issues. But there are times when One must disregard even the most sacred of vows - especially when One feels a great injustice is about to be done. We refer to the amendment to the by-laws requiring life members to pay dues if they are to be eligible for year-end trophies. This motion smacks of low-dollar extortion in Our eyes: life members who compete for year-end trophies are paying their way by the very fact that they are paying entry fees, and through the years they've paid their dues, both literally and figuratively; life members who don't compete for year-end trophies aren't going to pay the dues - and perhaps become incensed that we would demand them, so what have we gained? Many of these members would gladly write a check in the three-digit range if asked because of the enjoyment they derived from the Club and the fact that they don't want to see it go belly-up for lack of operating funds. Yet to demand "dues" invokes a feeling of callousness that they don't expect from their friends. We urge you to show the class We've come to expect from VMSC and defeat this amendment.

Yet We are not blind to the financial problems the Club is experiencing and We would like to offer some viable alternatives. We suggest increasing Checkpoints subscriptions to \$10.00 per year. This is not only more diplomatic but reflects the harsh reality of printing and postage.

Any cost-cutting measure is still a band-aid on a wound requiring a tourniquet. Our problem is not too many life members but too few new members. We propose that in December the Club mail to people on the publicity list invitations to the Awards Banquet and an invitation to join the Club with the initiation fee (\$25.00 - We do support this motion) waived and, if they join, their price for the banquet is reduced by two dollars a person. We feel that, in this proposal, the long-term gains far outweigh any short-term losses (and does anyone consider a new member a loss?) the Club might experience. It would also permit new members to meet the Club in a festive, less-than-competitive environment. And who knows how many will start lusting after the pewter they see the older members getting?

We feel these are positive options to the currently-proposed negative answer.



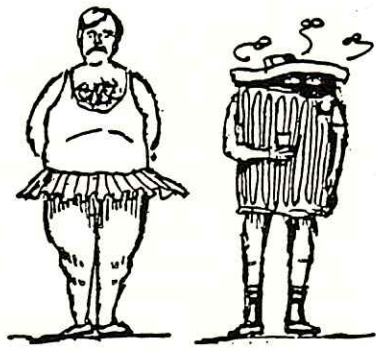
