I'M OKAY, YOU'RE OFF-COURSE by Gary Stout

As the problems of old age become more acute, I'm discovering that it requires about two months to recuperate from the crippling effects of writer's cramp (and a severe case of I-really-don't-feel-like-writing-that-tonightis). Thus explains the one month gap in articles.

As a forewarning, this piece will no doubt be the most straightforward and concise (read boring) of the five. There's really not a lot you can do or say to make rally equipment interesting, much less intriguing and mysterious. But, not wanting to permit the word "can't" to creep into a discourse on rallying, I'll try:

It was a tiny, sordid basement-saloon (in Marrakesh, I believe- an incidental detail, except to place the scene in the squalor and poverty that plagues cities of the sort). The faint, yet piquant, aroma of anisette mixed with the musky smoke-filled air. Air so heavy that you didn't breathe it so much as urge it into your lungs. I had frequented this dimly-lit crypt of a cafe for several months. It appealed to

my scant resources, the service was cordial but oblivious to less than above-board dealings, and occasional female companionship could be found (and for a reasonable price).

Yet this evening was to prove different-unique-a night I haven't forgotten since.

It was shortly past two. I was preparing for my usual lonely walk home after paying homage to another day of hopeless oblivion. Perhaps it was fate-luck, I think. At that moment, the door at the top of the stairs creaked its way open to reveal a face I recognized from a few of the American newspapers that filter their way onto the dust-covered streets. I had forgotten the name but remembered the face-chiseled, as if from granite, rich blue-black hair that served as a frame for his deep, sullen eyes, features hardened rich blue-black hair that served as a frame for his deep, sullen eyes, features hardened from years of TSD rallying. On his arm was a woman- of oriental extraction I would have guessed. Her appearance in perfect counterpoint to his- soft, subtle, understated. She was wearing a silk sarong-like gown of aqua and gold that revealed more to the mind than to the eyes.

To my great fortune, not a table was empty. I seized the opportunity to offer to share mine. I had rallied before, in what seemed like a previous life it was so long ago

and far removed, but never with any, even middling, success. Perhaps this was my chance to turn my career around- yes, a chance, that's all I truly needed.

My vain attempts to steer the conversation toward rallying were elegantly blunted.

Words such as "CAS", "jog", and "checkpoint" brought no response. I felt crushed, as if the sleazy building had engulfed me. It was then that he leaned across the small table, with that piercing, logic-filled glare that seasoned rallyists develop, and asked, "what are you after?"

As if I were some trained parrot, I immediately defined "after" in its normal dictionary sense. Embarrassed and humiliated, I recounted tearfully my abortive endeavors at the

sport in which he was so accomplished.

It might have been that this great man took pity on me (although I doubt this, rallyists never show pity- unless, of course, it's defined in the Glossary), but he began to expound articulately his philosophy of rallying. But even he admitted he could only guess

why he had been so successful.

"Equipment. Equipment, that's the key. You don't win if you don't have the right equipment." I found myself appreciating the man's straightforwardness. "I'm not talking equipment." I lound myself appreciating the man's straightforwardness. "I'm not talking Kerons, computers, driven/non-driven sending units. I'm talking equipment. The kind you can throw in your Olds 88, and go out and win a rally. Pens, lots of pens. Different colors, too- I like colors. Use them to circle pauses, speed changes, NRCs, NVNs, whatever- I like circles, too. Hi-liters, also, use them to mark off instructions. If you go off-course, you can read the instructions again. Don't use magic markers, you can't read what you've gone over- and they bleed through to the next sheet". He appeared to be warming to my raptured attention as his hands began making sweeping, wide gestures as he spoke. "I always carried tape- duct tape, scotch tape, masking tape. Had a thing for tape- couldn't keep enough of it. And those pads of yellow note paper with the adhesive on one side, and 3 x 5 cards. Great for writing notes and Special Instructions. Instruction goes into effect, stick it on the dash. Instruction is cancelled, yank it off and throw it in the back- neatness never won a rally!!"

His speech had become almost staccato-like as he bombarded me with this priceless information. "Get yourself a calculator and watch. How good they are should depend on how good you are. The better you get, the better they ought to be. Kept all this junk in a blue plastic file box. Rally coming up- just grab the box, everything's there. No

fuss, no bother".

He lit a cigarette and drew heavily on it, as if to add emphasis to his next point. "Center-mount clipboard- best thing I ever did. Lets the driver read the instructions, too. You know how bad their memories are." I nodded knowingly, recalling several amnesia cases I'd rallied with. "Doesn't have to be fancy. But everything's there for the world to see. You don't have to worry that he's looking for 648 when he should be looking for '648'. Best piece of equipment you'll ever get. If God rallied, He'd have a centermount clipboard".

"I could go on. Things like fix-a-flat, jumper cables, tool box, but I always felt they were like a self-fulfilling prophecy. Look kid, it's getting late and a good rally-ist is always in bed by four. Just remember- equipment". I nodded gratefully as he arose to disappear into the misty shroud that was a constant of this habitat.

As sudden as his departure was the enlightened feeling that gripped me at that instant. It was as if I had met a great prophet of yore who had blessed me with wisdom many pay princely sums to acquire.

The next morning I awoke, and, armed with the knowledge I had been granted, departed those dismal, decrepit surroundings to chart a new course with my life and my rallying.

CURRENT BYLAWS

PROPOSED BYLAWS

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP 1. REGULAR MEMBERS

Membership in the Club shall be restricted to persons who are interested in the Club and its objectives. Applications for membership, accompanied by payment of the initiation fee and appropriate dues, must be signed by two members in good standing and approved by the Board of Directors. Effective January 1, 1980 new members must be at least 10 years old.

Membership in the Club shall be restricted to persons who are interested in the Club and its objectives. Applications for membership, accompanied by payment of the appropriate fees, as specified in the <u>VMSC PRICE SCHTULE</u>, MUST be signed by two members in good standing and approved by the Board of Directors. Effective January 1, 1980, any new member must be at least 10 years old.

ARTICLE IV

- I. Annual dues shall be \$15.00 for a single membership. Annual dues for multiple mamberships at a single address shall be \$15.00 for the first dues paying member, and \$7.50 for each additional dues paying member, and shall be payable on or before January 1.

VI TREASURER.
