# PICK UP STIX II by Gary Stout

The 1986 competition season for VMSC ended on Dec. 14 with Pick Up Stix II, Barbara and Wilt Greenwood serving as rallymasters. The concept of the event was a modified stick map, quite similar to the one they

staged two years previously.

The stick map used for the rally consisted of the main stick map (the "Big Stick"), drawn from the bottom to the top of the page. Travelling up the Big Stick, the rallyist would encounter "branches" (portions of the Big Stick) and corresponding parallel "twigs" (mini stick maps as it were) set off to the right of each branch. If the twig and the branch could both be executed, the twig had priority. Once begun, the twig or branch had to be completed in its entirety before continuing the Big Stick.

The first leg was simply a warm-up leg to get everyone used to the stick map concept (they aren't seen often and rally rust seems to form

quickly).

heg two posed the almost obligatory branch/twig priority problem. This was followed by a trap based on the fact that only routes identified by three-digit numbers existed during the stick map portion. You were off course if you executed a straight at a depiction of a crossroad at moute 33.

The fourth leg was a permutation of the twig/branch priority problem. The branch had a mileage at its first intersection. However, official mileages carried no special weight as is normal, and thus the twig once again had priority.


Leg five's twig had its first intersection noted with an official mileage. Careful observation at that point revealed that the road was

marked as dead-end and non-existant.

This brought everyone to the Greenwood's Annual "Nasty Hooker on the Last Control." Most who are familiar with the rallies of Barbara and Wilt can usually determine where it is that they are about to be had; it is then their responsibility to decipher the logic. On this day, only one team managed to correctly execute this leg. As you approached the apparent crossroad of 271 and 622, it could be seen that 622 was dead-end to the right. However, the generals stated that routes (not roads) identified as dead-end were non-existant, so all of 622 was non-existant at that point. Those of us who turned left onto 622 at least appreciated the detailed and graphic critique on the leg slip.

It was refreshing to see the Greenwoods back, and, as usual, the event

was flawless, well-looped, and squeaky clean.


