



1986 PORSCHE FAMILY OF THE YEAR

Enthusiastic, loyal, dedicated — these are but a few of the words that can be used to describe the Hatches — 1986 Porsche Family of the Year.

Dick and Caryl Hatch have been interested in Porsches since they bought their first Porsche in 1963. Little did anyone know that this initial purchase would lead the way to becoming Porsche

Family of the Year.

The Hatches true committment to Porsches came in 1969 when they joined the Porsche Club of America (PCA). They both helped organize the Richmond-based First Settlers Region, which was chartered in 1970. Over the years, the two have held numerous posts in both the First Settlers Region and the Blue Ridge Region (BRR). (Which, incidentally, they helped charter here in 1980.)



Virginia Motor Sport Club was instrumental in the Hatch's receiving the national award, "Porsche Family of the Year", this year.

Dick joined VMSC in 1959 then owning a TR3, and Caryl joined in 1962 owning a Sprite. Becoming involved in VMSC in various capacities as officers, editors, board members (for 8 years) started them on the road to an enthusiasm of sports car activities. They got rid of the Sprite and became the proud owners of a '63 356 speedster belonging to George & Shirley Patterson (also VMSC members). This entailed them becoming interested in Porsche activities as well as VMSCs. The Wrights, Greenwoods, Chehaskes, Roses, Peaseley and Whiteheads all had Porsches, so there was some friendly competition.

Down through the years the group have obtained other vehicles and/or moved out of town. The Wrights, Chehaskes and Peaseleys (Brad has a new 911) moved. The Chehaskes and Peaseleys frequently attend the annual banquet. Bill Whitehead is still visible at VMSC events (in his Porsche though a different model than he started out competing in), and the Greenwoods are always there.

The Hatchs moved around in the '70's ending up in Roanoke. Where they became heavily envolved in the local Porsche Club. Both have finished in the top 4 over all since 1981. Dick taking 1st place in '82, '83 and '85 and Caryl in '86.

Caryl remembers her first autocross/gymkahana 1st place VMSC trophy, and that was when she drove blindfolded with Dick as navigator in 1966. Dick took a 2nd place, not faring as well when it was his turn to drive by catching his fingers in the car door, while being blindfolded. Another memorable event was at the VMSC concours where different presentation ideas of the vehicle were done, to make them more appealing to the judges. The Hatch's Karman Ghia, on a silver platter (yards and yards of aluminum foil) was fine till the judges closed the car door. The patter of sand, rocks, dirt etc. was hillarious. To the delight of everyone, a repeat performance of the car door was held, the judges wanted to make sure they heard correctly. Caryl had not cleaned underneath. One of her goofs at being editor was when she printed rubber carburetors instead of webber carburetors. Want to try them on your car? One of Dick's greatest moments in history was receiving the framed artistic rendition of the 20th place award at the '83 banquet. He maintains getting the 20th place is harder than 1st.

This year all their VMSC and Porsche club activities paid off. At the national Porsche convention they were named, along with their son Rick, as "1986 Porsche Family of the Year".

The Daytona 24 hours calls Dick this year, but hopefully next year you will again see the Hatchs at the VMSC banquet.




