

RACEHORSES AND WORKHORSES

We all know the difference between a racehorse and workhorse.

The high strung, thoroughbred racehorse stands in stark contrast to his heavy, placid, muscular cousin, the workhorse.

Recently, I developed an automotive perspective on the subject. It began recently at the IMSA-GTO-GTU races. Built from the ground up as racers, these silhouettes of production cars are exceptioally quick and nimble, running Summit Points two mile, ten turn course averaging over 90 mph.

Built for racing too, are the LMS cars of NASCAR. Recently, I went to the races at Southside Speedway. The formidable "push bars" and roll cages giving notice that these cars use contact as a matter of winning, not cheating. This being necessary when the cars are averaging around 80 mph on a shallow banked 3/8 mile track.

At Summit I relaxed for a weekend, camped, drank too much around the campfire, and generally unwound.

There was a 6 hour endurance race for compact and subcompact cars, the Sports and Touring Classes. The Sports class was won by a Dodge Chargerturbo, out running BMW's, Volvos, and Acura Legend and an Alfa Romeo Milano in the process. The Touring class was won by a Rabbit GTI who over came a slew of Hondas, Toyotas, an fellow VW's in doing so. In the 3 hour endoro Sunday, GM's Firebirds and Z-28's outlasted the 944's and 300ZX's.

At Southside I relaxed very little, as I was constantly turning to the left, to watch the racing. (I managed to get to the infield) My own misconceptions about Southside racers and fans began to evaporate. There was contact on the track, but none off. These guys are as serious about winning their classes as a Ribbs or Gloy is his.

And there was as much comradeship between crews, as I have ever seen at any racing event. As for the fans, I saw no guns, no pink slippers and no fights.

At Summit, I saw a classic Ribbs-Pickett duel and, as Pickett stopped for a tire change, Ribbs took, and held, the lead. Toyota over Chevrolet. In GTU, Amos Johnson's Mazda beat Bob Leitzinger's Nissan to the flag.

Reflecting on the two experiences, I left Summit having seen mostly professional drivers in combat with the most technologically advanced racers science can provide: lean, light and bred to run.

Leaving Southside, only minutes from home, I realized I had seen good close racing, not by paid professionals but, by racers who, for the most part, work a 40 hour/week job and race purely for love of the sport. Thinking back to the LMS cars and the Blankenships; Zervakisis and Pattersons who race them, I thought about the apparent simplicity of the cars; the two barrel carb, the cast iron exhaust, the stout frame, built to survive the blows of a short track. They seemed more docile, and somewhat friendlier than their IMSA cousins.

Somewhat like a workhorse.
