



It is people getting sponsors in order to compete in the <a href="Stock class">Stock class</a>. It is contingency money to winners who use the designated tires, shocks, <a href="mufflers">mufflers</a>, etc. It was a check for \$5000 awarded to somebody who won the "triple crown of autocrossing." It is the removal of the word "fun" from the autocrosser's vocabulary (to be replaced with "professionalism").

Think I'm crazy? crying "wolf"?-- look back to the Sixties (those of us who were around and still remember that golden era of the automobile) and amateur road racing. True, there were the professional series, but there was room for the amateurs to race without ponying up all present and future life savings and earnings along with several large anatomical appendages. Then, unfortunately, Corporate America realized that there was a degree of validity to the phrase "win on Sunday-- sell on Monday." Does anyone see a pattern here? # RALLY REPORT FADE TO BLACK (THE EULOGY) by Gary Stout


With the continued depletion of the ranks of Rallymasters in VMSC, there are few people remaining who stage events that I, for one, genuinely look forward to and anticipate running. Floyd and Marvin Mills have been two such people. Their events can be characterized as unique and, perhaps more importantly, sportsmanlike-- low blows need not apply. However and unfortunately, with their self-descriptively titled "Fade to Black", they too appear to have declared a state of retirement. Of course, we can always hope-- after all, how many times has Rocky resurrected himself.


The format of the rally was strictly Do-It-Yourself. With the exception of two closed, manned controls (to dissuade anyone with visions of a Monte Carlo), it was DIY all day long--calculate time-in, zero odometer, assign out-time, and motor on in a control-free, hermetically-sealed, tamper-proof environment.

The traps were of the plain-brown-wrapper variety: free zone/overlap; blank instruction; non-pause at a non-existing road; turn at end of route (not your route, just a route; confidence leg; and so on. Gratefully, considering the only control slip was a compendium distributed at the finish, there were no earth-shattering, precedent-setting traps that could send contestants off to the nether reaches of countryside Virginia.

Upon reflection, the difficulty of conducting such a rally lies not in the duplication of traps (double jeopardy, so to speak, and not applicable on this rally-sportsmanship, remember?). No, the major task is to avoid using earlier traps for common course following later. Even with control slips this can be a problem. But without information and, effectively, no call-back mileages, Rallymasters can court catastrophe with just a minor oversight.

"Quit while you're ahead" is an all-too-common cliche, but in this case it is more than accurate-- for that is exactly what the Mills Brothers are doing. Those of us who ran "Mainframe", "Split Decision", and "Fade to Black" will sorely miss them--their imagination and their creativity.


