#### Say NO to Drunk Driving

The following was spotted in the "Blau Rain" (newsletter for the Blue Ridge Region of the Porsche Club of America) and we felt it worth reprinting.

If you think the penalties for drunk driving in the U.S. are harsh, check out what some other countries think of DUI drivers.

AUSTRALIA - The names of drivers are sent to the local newspaper and are printed under the heading: "He's drunk and in jail."

BULGARIA - A second conviction results in execution.

COSTA RICA - Police remove plates from offender's car.

EL SALVADOR - Your first offense is your last, as punishment is execution by firing squad.

ENGLAND - One year license suspension, a \$250.00 fine, and one year in jail.

FINLAND - Driver is automatically jailed for one year at hard labor.

FRANCE - Drivers are punished with a three year loss of license, one year in jail, and a \$1,000.00 fine.

MALAYA - Driver is jailed; if he's married, his wife is also jailed.

NORWAY - Three weeks in jail at hard labor, one year loss of license. If the driver commits a second offense within five years, his license is revoked forever.

POLAND - Jailed and forced to attend political lectures.

RUSSIA - License is revoked for life.

SOUTH AFRICA - A ten year prison sentence or a \$10,000.00 fine or both.

SWEDEN - Driver is jailed for one year at hard labor.

TURKEY - Driver is taken 20 miles from town and forced to walk back under escort.

There are two ways to avoid any penalty for drunk driving. One way is to kill yourself in an accident, the other way is a lot easier: DON'T DRINK AND DRIVE. We want you around to enjoy this year's activities.




