

Solution to August Different Stuff

The Teams:

Using the introduction, we see that the ladies ran together and that both Katy and Judy were drivers, therefore they were not a team. Since the equipped class has the most teams (clue 5), then Judy and her partner along with Scott and his partner all competed in this class. The Cars:


Bill and his partner did not compete in the Honda (clue 4) and since the Honda team was competing for the first time, it could not have been used by Wilt and his partner nor Mike and his partner nor Katy and her partner (all veterans); therefore, the Honda was used by Judy and her partner. Jet and her partner competed in the MG (clue 3). Scott and his partner did not use the Fiat nor the BMW (clue 3), therefore they competed in the Volvo. The remaining two teams are in different classes and since the BMW was in the equipped class, then it was used by Mike and his partner while Wilt and his partner competed in the Fiat by process of elimanation.
