





DIRT SIMPLE! REPORT

We arrived at the start of the rally, on an absolutely gorgeous day, filled with excitement and anticipation. We were finally getting an opportunity to compete in a rally, our first of 1991. We were ready, however the day was so nice our computer decided to take a day off and we left the start desperately trying to remember how to manually calculate.

Leg 1 was trap free. You only had to remember the course following priorities and that where a choice of directions existed, you went Left. We however, introduced our own level of difficulty by ineptly calculating our speed correction factor and blasted into the control early. We proceed onward, still trying to remember how to perform the calculations.

Leg 2 provided the first subtle trap. An instruction simply stated 'Go most nearly Right' but since it did not contain NRC, a route change was required. The instruction was executed at an intersection where two routes went to the right, your current route at approximately 90 degrees and a bear right onto a new route. Brief argument, then onward - correctly.

Leg 3 reversed the above logic with an instruction stating 'Don't turn Left. NRC." which was executed immediately after the proceeding instruction, since it did not require a route change and did not have to occur at an intersection.

Leg 4 was a simple overlap problem, requiring you to complete the distance over which a pause was in effect before going on to the next instruction. Oh yes, you had to execute a course following priority in the middle of said distance. Again calculations prove faulty.

Leg 5 was the old 'st' trap. You had to 'Turn at route 636' which happened to be the very route you were travelling on, so you simply changed routes at the first opportunity.

Leg 6 was a "confidence leg" which required you to execute many instructions without any positive indication that you were correct.

Leg 7 was another confidence leg. This time you traversed almost 20 miles while executing a minimum of instructions and remembering the previous leg.

Leg 8 used a Special instruction to turn you onto roads whose numbers were divisible by 5. If you ignored the remainders after you divided (and calculated correctly) you did well.

Many thanks to the Greenwoods, and the workers, for a delightful event. Finally, Scott - PLEASE get the computer fixed.
