

The following is reprinted from a recent copy of the Steering Column (TSCC's newsletter).

THE ALLBUSTER 250 RALLYE

The AllBuster 250 is a very brisk (insanely fast) night endurance Rally. It is a standard TSD event with traps being limited to course-following and timing. All controls will be closed and timing will be cumulative. This first annual event is not sanctioned by anyone, has no sponsership, and the organizers of the event are in no way liable nor responsible for this event. Insurance coverage was to have been provided by Vladmir's of Leningrad. While this event is suitable for novice teams, competitors who have not participated in at least three (3) World Safari Rallies or previous AllBusters will be required to sign special liability waivers, last wills and testaments, etc. (all co-signed by their attorneys and notarized by a federal judge).

Rally headquarters is the Notell Motel (located behind the stockyards) in downtown New Westport, CT. Rooms are available on an hourly basis, first come, first serve. Pre-registration by midnight March 1st, 1992 is mandatory unless registering the day of the event.

Route instructions will be Specials, Numbered, Lettered, (or whatever) and will be in a mixture of formats including text, tulip, stick maps, mole diagrams, overhead photographs, magnetic heading vectors, maps, and essays in paragraph form. Overlap of instructions will be limited unless the Busters of the Meet deem it otherwise.

Unpaved roads will comprise less than 50% of the course with the remainder consisting of cow paths, primitive trails, river beds (dry or otherwise), railroad grades, utility access lanes, and farm fields.

Signs and landmarks will be any damn thing the BM's decide to use but will be visible from the rally course (using not more than 100x binoculars).

The modified Countie-Mountie rule (new for 1992) is in effect and therefore all speed changes will occur midway between any two speed limit signs requiring a change to the average of the two posted limits, with a last resort speed of 87.5 mph.

Trophies will be awarded to the highest placed survivor in each class with special awards going to the highest placed novice team that maxes every leg and to the driver who does the most damage to a car owned by their navigator.



The entry fee is \$120 on or before the event and \$150 after. This event runs under the 1991 AllBuster Rallye Regulations (vols. 1 thru 5) which, for an additional \$25 per volume, will be mailed with the Generals. Competitors should be aware that these regulations will be modified on an as-needed basis by the BM's during the event and after - entrants are responsible for keeping abreast of these changes.

Required equipment: spare tires (4), jacks, winches, Gyro compass, helmets, life vests, Emergency Locator Transmitter, valid passport, and all necessary shots.

Optional equipment: any standard rally stuff.

All contestants receive a free T-shirt featuring the logo (a skull and crossbones) in full color and the slogan "Next year I'll work". Register today by calling 1-800-555-1212 and ask for Lucky or Spike.

Solution to December Different Stuff

The car that finished fifth was not the Marlboro entry (clue 1), the Williams entry (clue 2), the Tyrrell entry (clue 3), nor the Benetton entry (clue 6); it was the Leyton House entry. It was not driven by Nelson (clue 3), Nigel (clue 4), Aryton (clue 5), nor by Gerhard (clue 6); it was driven by Alain.

The car that finished first was not the Lotus (clue 1), the Lola (clue 3), nor the Ferrari (clue 6); it was either the McLaren or the Brabham. It was not driven by Senna (clue 1), Berger (clue 2), Prost (clue 5), nor by Mansell (clue 7); it was driven by Piquet. It was not driven by Nigel (clue 4) nor by Gerhard (clue 6); it was driven by either Aryton or Nelson. The McLaren was not driven by either Nelson (clue 3) or Aryton (clue 5), therefore the Brabham either Nelson (clue 3) or Aryton (clue 5); therefore, the Brabham finished first. The Brabham was not the Tyrrell entry (clue 3), the Benetton entry (clue 4), nor the Williams entry (clue 7); it was entered by the Marlboro team. It was not driven by Nelson (clue 1); therefore it was driven by Aryton.

There are three positions; 2nd, 3rd, and 4th remaining and three teams; Benetton, Williams, and Tyrrell. Neither the Benetton nor the Neither the Benetton nor the Williams can be 4th (clues 6 & 2); therefore the Tyrrell entry was fourth, and the Lola finished fifth (clue 3). The Williams entry was not driven by Berger (clue 2), Prost (clue 5), nor Mansell (clue 7); it was driven by Senna. Since the Lotus finished ahead of Senna in the Williams entry; then the Williams was third and the Benetton entry was second by process of elimanation. The Lotus, therefore is the Benetton entry.

The Ferrari was not driven by Nigel (clue 4) nor Gerhard (clue 6) and since Aryton drove the Brabham to first and Alain drove the Lola to fifth; then Nelson drove the Ferrari. The forth place Tyrrell finished after the Ferrari driven by Nelson (clue 3); thus the Ferrari was third leaving the McLaren to be the Tyrrell entry in forth place and making the Ferrari, the Williams entry driven by Nelson Senna.

Mansell is not the Tyrell Mclaren driver, the Benetton Lotus driver, the Marlboro Brabham driver, nor the Williams Ferrari driver (all per clue 7); therefore Mansell drove the Leyton House Lola to fifth place and is Alain.
Since Gerhard finished before the third place Ferrari (clue 6);

he finished second in the Benetton Lotus and since Berger finished after the third place Williams entry (clue 2); he finished forth in the Tyrrell McLaren. Therefore Nigel is Berger and Gerhard is Prost by process of elimanation.
The solution therefore is:

> ARYTON PIQUET - BRABHAM - MARLBORO - 1st - 2nd 55 Points GERHARD PROST - LOTUS - BENETTON 53 Points NELSON SENNA - FERRARI - WILLIAMS - 3rd 51 Points NIGEL BERGER - McLAREN - TYRRELL - 4th 49 Points ALAIN MANSELL - LOLA - LEYTON HOUSE - 5th 47 Points
