NEW MEMBER

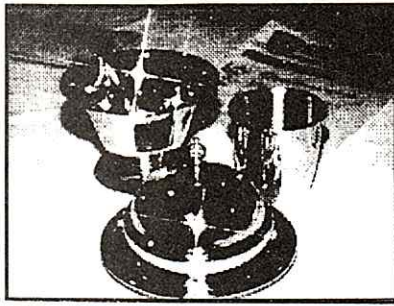

PERSONAL NOTE

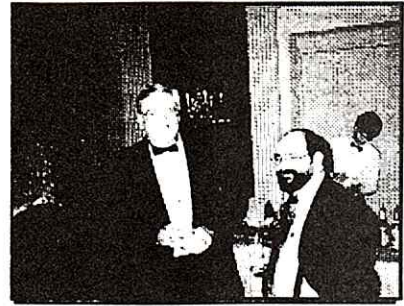

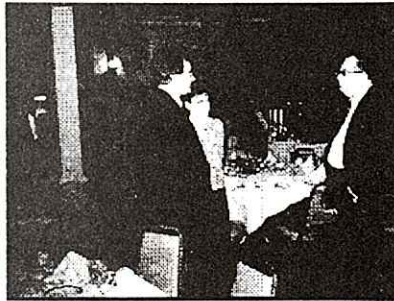

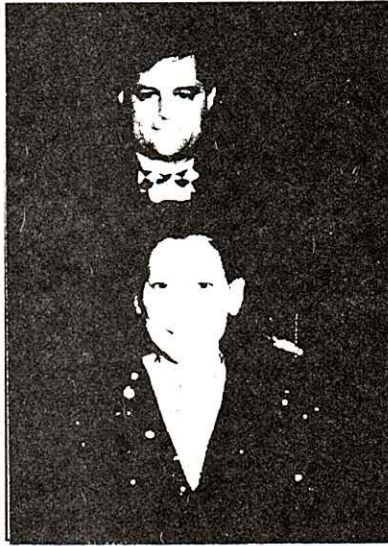
