

Since I do not have a contributor this month for this column, I am going to fill in. The following tips will be aimed at the novice as is based on my limited experience. These are items that have worked for me. I hope that they will help you, the beginner.

- Running an autocross with a full tank of gas is carrying extra weight around. If you run with too little gas in the tank, you may slosh the fuel to one side exposing the fuel pick up. This can cause a loss of power when exiting a turn. I have found that a 1/4 tank works well.
- If it is your first couple times at running a rally and the team is new to the sport, concentrate on following the course. If you are able to properly interpret the instruction, (don't forget the generals) you stand a good chance of not maxing the checkpoints.
 Develop course following skills first.
- Proper tire pressure is very important when running an autocross course. Usually street pressures are inadequate for competition. The excessive Gs can cause the tire to roll beyond design limits. When this happens, the contact patch is minimal and the tire not working properly. Start with a pressure that you think is above the optimal and work backwards. After a run check the wear on the tire and lower a pound or two. Eventually, you will find what works best.
- A novice rallist can benefit greatly by helping put on a rally. Team up with an experienced rally master. You will walk away with a far better understanding of rallying.




